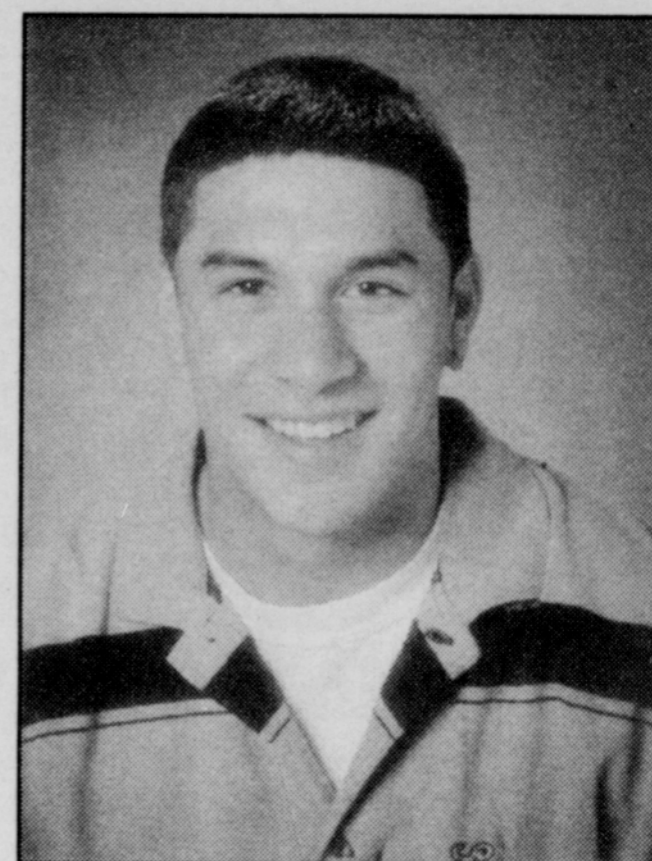
SVS Says Thanks for Help
