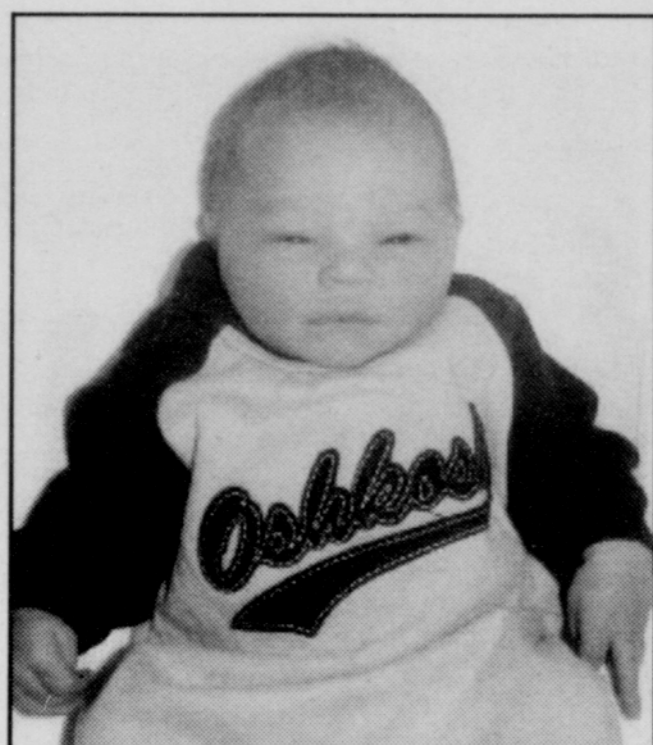

New Babies!

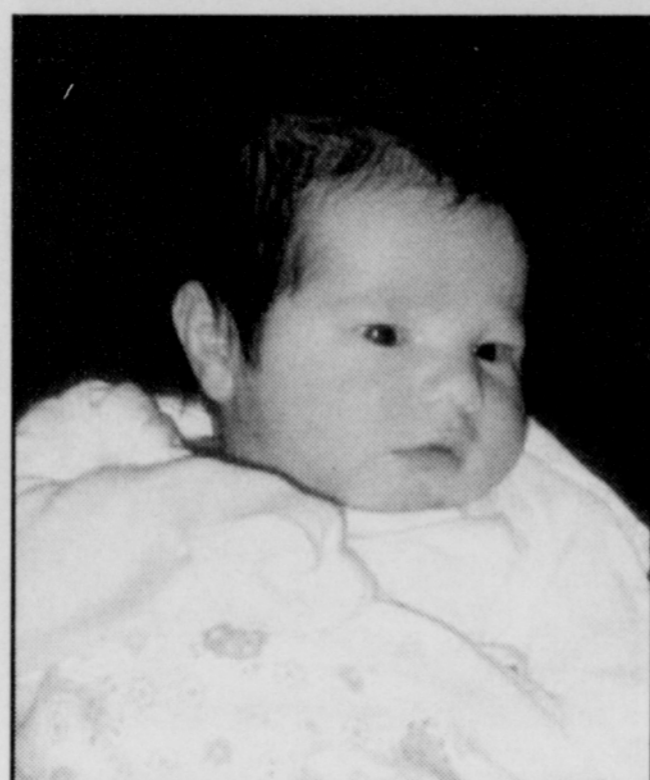


Ashten Shane Daniel Reavely

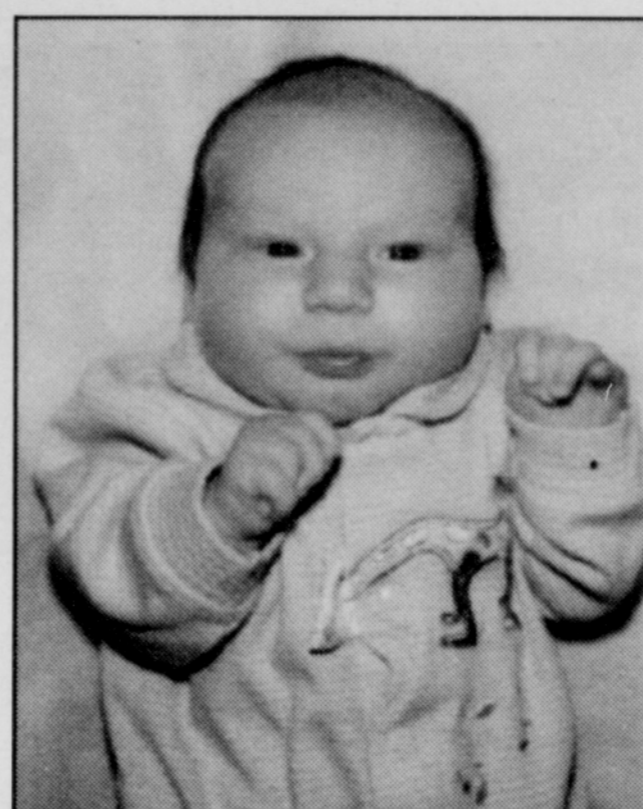


Cameron Erin Fisher

Christopher Martin LeLaCheur

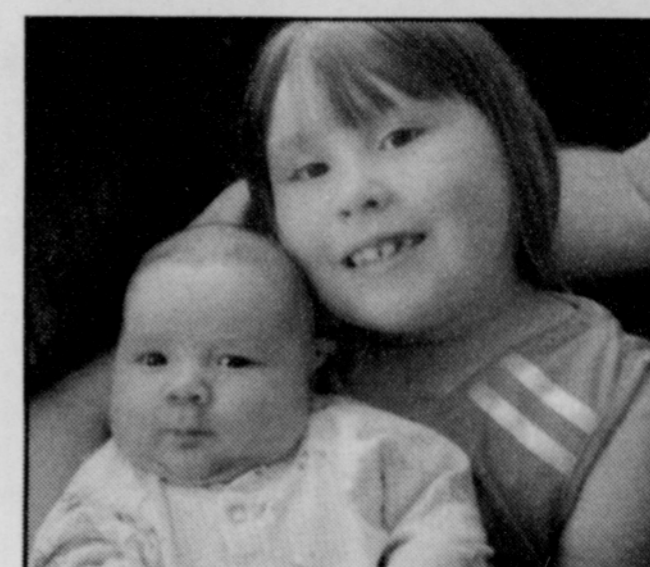
Welcome, Christopher Martin LeLaCheur to Kelley Ellis and Brandon LeLaCheur on April 20, 2004.
