

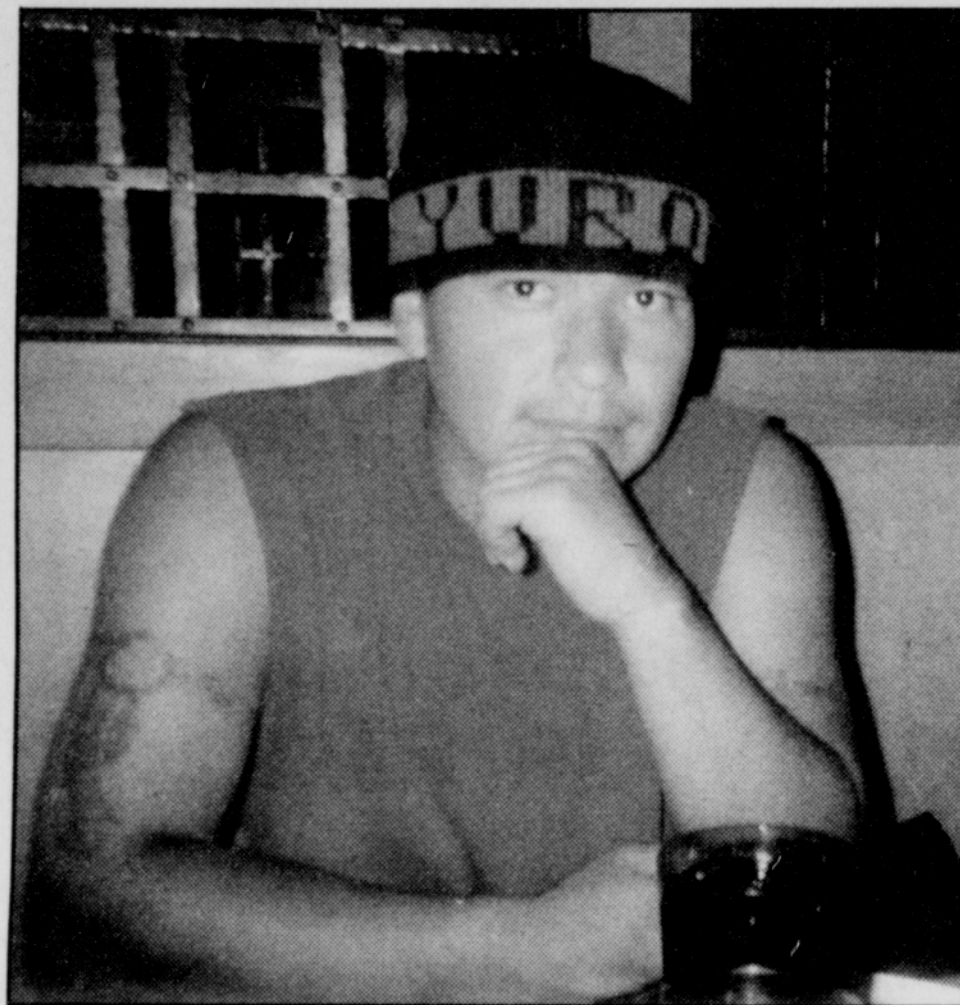

Tyrone Roman Scott 1977-2005

Tyrone was born Jan. 21, 1977. He passed away Jan. 22, 2005, in Siletz, Ore. He was 28 years and 1 day.

He lived in Siletz for the past six years. He was the son of Fredrick "Buzzy" Scott and Letha Robinson. He loved to hunt and fish. He was a family man. He loved his children, Wesley and Miakoda, and his stepson, Donovan.

He was always around his friends, had a lot of neighborhood kids over playing on his trampoline, playing basketball, and played walkie-talkie tag at night.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Fredrick Sr. and Norma

"Molly" Scott, and Ardes and Eldred Norris; and a brother, Byron Scott.

He is survived by numerous brothers and sisters, step-sisters and -brothers, aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, and by his closest cousins – Ryan, Nathan, Dustin, and Alyssa Scott.

His services were held in Siletz at the Long House on Jan. 26, 2005, at which time he was driven home to Smith River, Calif., for a three-night stay in the Indian Shaker Church.

Funeral services were held Jan. 29, 2005, and interment followed at HOW ON QUET Cemetery.
