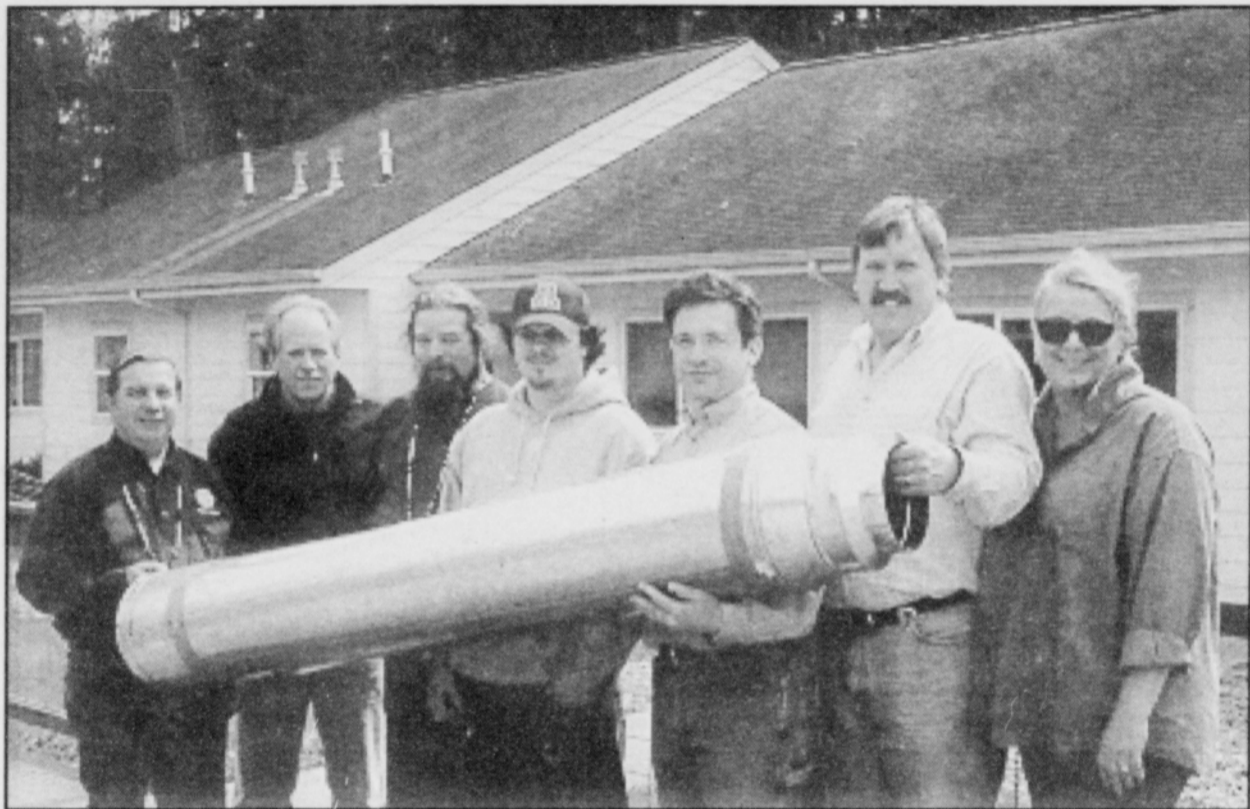

## Tribe Awarded HUD Funding for New USDA Building

The Siletz Tribe received notice April 8, 2005, that Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded it \$500,000 under the Indian Community Development Block Grant Program for construction of a new USDA food distribution warehouse.

The new building will be located on the Dundas property east of the city of Siletz on Logsdan Road on the site next to the tribe's fleet storage area.

The building will be approximately 6,300 square feet with a raised foundation to accommodate the unloading of

distribution trucks. The plan is to have a large enough area for trucks to enter and exit quickly and safely.

The plan calls for a warehouse area for adequate storage and movement of product, plus a demonstration kitchen, waiting room, nutrition education classroom area, and intake offices.

The building will be designed to be ADA compliant with proper access for disabled tribal members and their families.

The project will begin shortly with work on the water and sewer infrastructure and site preparation.

## Chinook Winds Casino Resort Expands with Purchase of Lakeside Golf Course and Health Club

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and Chinook Winds Casino Resort are proud to announce the purchase of the Lakeside Golf Course and Health Club. This purchase is another component in establishing Chinook Winds as a complete destination resort.

Delores Pigsley, Tribal Council chairman for the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, sees this acquisition as the next logical step.

"The tribe is pleased with the steps taken to create Chinook Winds as a premiere resort replete with headline entertainment, conventions, gambling, dining, ocean-front lodging, and now golf. Our goal is to attract more visitors to the area, as well as diversify the economic businesses and investments of the Siletz Tribe," she said. "We will offer employment to most of the current employees of the golf course and health club."

"The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians council and Chinook Winds Casino Resort have a long-term strategic plan that positions the property as the premiere destination resort on the Oregon Coast," said Jim Kikumoto, general manager of Chinook Winds. "The addition of the Lakeside Golf Course, now known as Chinook Winds Golf Resort, provides another opportunity to offer our guests an

additional amenity as well as attracting a new market segment that regularly visits Bend and Bandon Dunes to golf. Local members can look forward to no immediate rate changes, as well as our commitment to adding more value to their current golf or health club membership."

The latest acquisition is the third step in the tribe's continuing plan to accomplish the goal of a destination resort. The first was the purchase of the hotel located next to the casino. Next was the construction of Logan Road RV Park, a state-of-the-art facility located just blocks north of the casino.

Looking ahead to the future of Chinook Winds Golf Resort, the general three-year plan for the golf course will include taking an executive level course to a resort level. This will involve increasing the course size to 6,640 yards and the par to 71.

Chinook Winds Casino Resort offers 24-hour Las Vegas-style gaming, headline entertainment from some of music's most legendary stars, three full-service restaurants, secure child care facility and arcade, and a 247-room ocean-view hotel.
