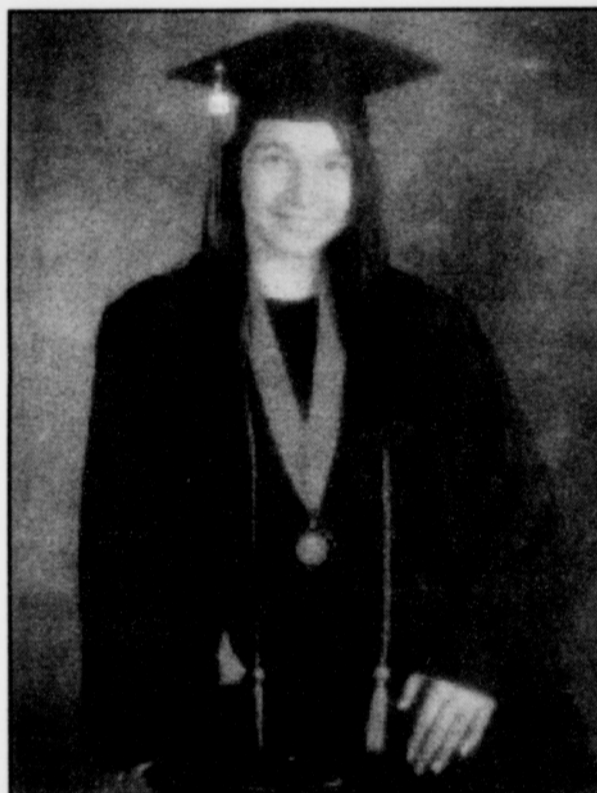

"Hot for each other" Delores Riding In and Ken Blacketer Jr. ec-statically announce their engagement.

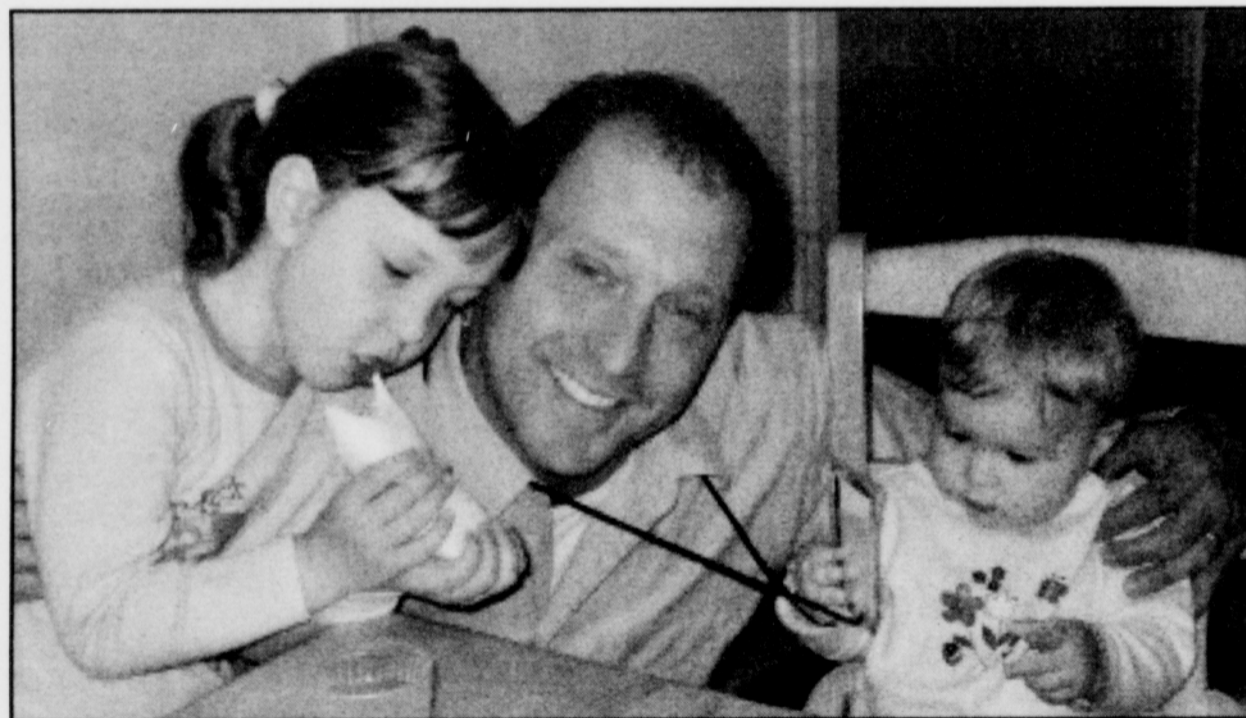
They will marry Oct. 16, 2005, in Portland, Ore. It's the third, and final, marriage for both.
