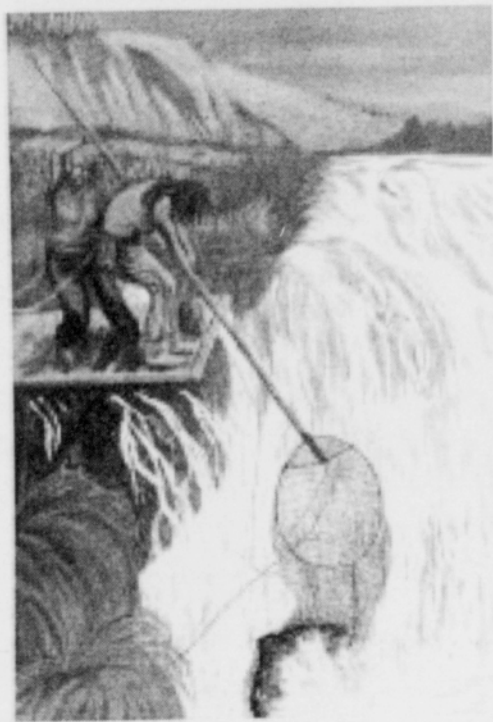

Computer Project Continues with Indian-Owned Company

This year, the Siletz Tribe is contracting with an Indian-owned firm - Lakota Office & Technology - to purchase and distribute desktop and laptop computers to tribal members who have not already received one.

Additionally, the Tribal Council added distribution of laptop computers to students who attend part-time, a minimum of six credit hours or more per term.

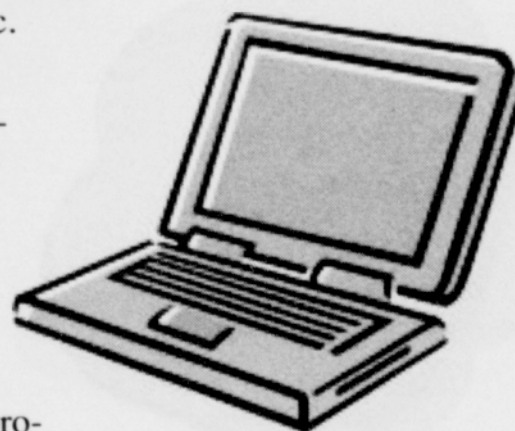
Below is a list of criteria for applying for each category:

Desktop

- Complete an application form
- Provide verification of your residence through a utility bill, rental agreement, property tax statement, etc.
- One per household/person/address

Laptop (full-time students)

- Complete an application form
- Provide verification of your residence through a utility bill, rental agreement, property tax statement, etc.
- One per person
- Provide verification of completion of two terms of college (AVT or Higher Education-equivalent program) with a minimum 2.0 GPA each term and 12 credit hours per term
- Provide verification of being enrolled full-time in your current term



Laptop (part-time students)

- Complete an application form
- Provide verification of your residence through a utility bill, rental agreement, property tax statement, etc.
- One per person
- Provide verification of completion of two terms of college (AVT or Higher Education-equivalent program) with a minimum 2.0 GPA/term and six credit hours/term
- Provide verification of being enrolled in six credit hours or more in your current term

If you would like to apply for a computer, please call Darlene Carkhuff or myself at 1-800-922-1399 or 541-444-2532. Please indicate which computer you are applying for and your current mailing address. We will ensure that you get an application.

Additionally, non-Siletz parents who have custody of tribal children can apply for a computer on behalf of their tribal child. Please indicate that you need an **NIC application** at the time you call.

Additionally, non-Siletz parents must provide verification that they have custody of the tribal child. If the child(ren) leaves their home, the computer must go with the tribal child.
