Join the Longest Relay Run in Oregon

12th Annual Run to the Rogue

At 234 miles, the Annual Run to the Rogue is the longest relay run in Oregon. It takes place this year on Sept. 7-9.

Runners or walkers can select the length and location of their run/walk along the Siletz-to-Rogue-River route.

This event celebrates the return of the Siletz Tribe to its ancestral lands in Rogue River country and is sponsored by the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians.

You are invited to join Siletz Tribal members for Run to the Rogue XII. Runners/walkers can join the group as it travels south on 101 and take part as long as they are able. You are not required to participate for all three days nor are teams required, but they can participate. Campsites, meals, and a T-shirt are provided.

Orientation and registration meetings: Sept. 6 at 6 p.m., with dinner at the Tribal Community Center in Siletz; and Sept. 7, 8 a.m., again at the community center. The run begins Sept. 7 at 8:30 a.m. at the community center and will end Sept. 9 at Oak Flat near Agness, Ore., with a salmon dinner at Singing Springs Resort.

Campsites: Sept. 7 at Jessie M. Honeyman Campground, group area F, south of Florence, Ore.; Sept. 8, at the group area in Humbug State Park, near Humbug Mountain, south of Port Orford, Ore. Maps will be provided.
