The Gifted Gable Celebrates Second Anniversary

The Gifted Gable, owned by Vance and Cynthia Farlow, recently celebrated its second anniversary of ownership by the Farlows.

The couple purchased the business more than two years ago when the opportunity presented itself to them. Cynthia, an elder of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, and her husband operate the store located in the Seven Gables Shoppes on Highway 101 in Lincoln City, Ore.

The Gifted Gable provides a venue through which local American Indian artists can sell their work to the public. The shop offers note cards with an American Indian theme, beaded jewelry, crystal sun catchers, beaded necklaces, and more.

Some of the beaded jewelry offered for sale is created by Cynthia. She also creates medal necklaces for veterans, which she sells at the shop. Cynthia also makes healing dream catchers.

Vance does beadwork, too, but is probably better known for his sparkly beaded spiders. Customers can choose from a variety of colors and then become a member of the "Ugly Lucky Spider Club." You'll have to ask Vance for the story behind the "club."

The shop isn't just about artwork. Customers will find a vast array of gifts available, including scented candles, creams and lotions, souvenirs, and more. The Farlows take pride in offering quality gifts at affordable prices.

They also offer bead supplies at The Gifted Gable. While they maintain a basic supply of beads, they are happy to order beads in bulk for their customers.

The shop is located at the Seven Gables Shoppes, across from DeLake School, on Highway 101. Store hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Monday.

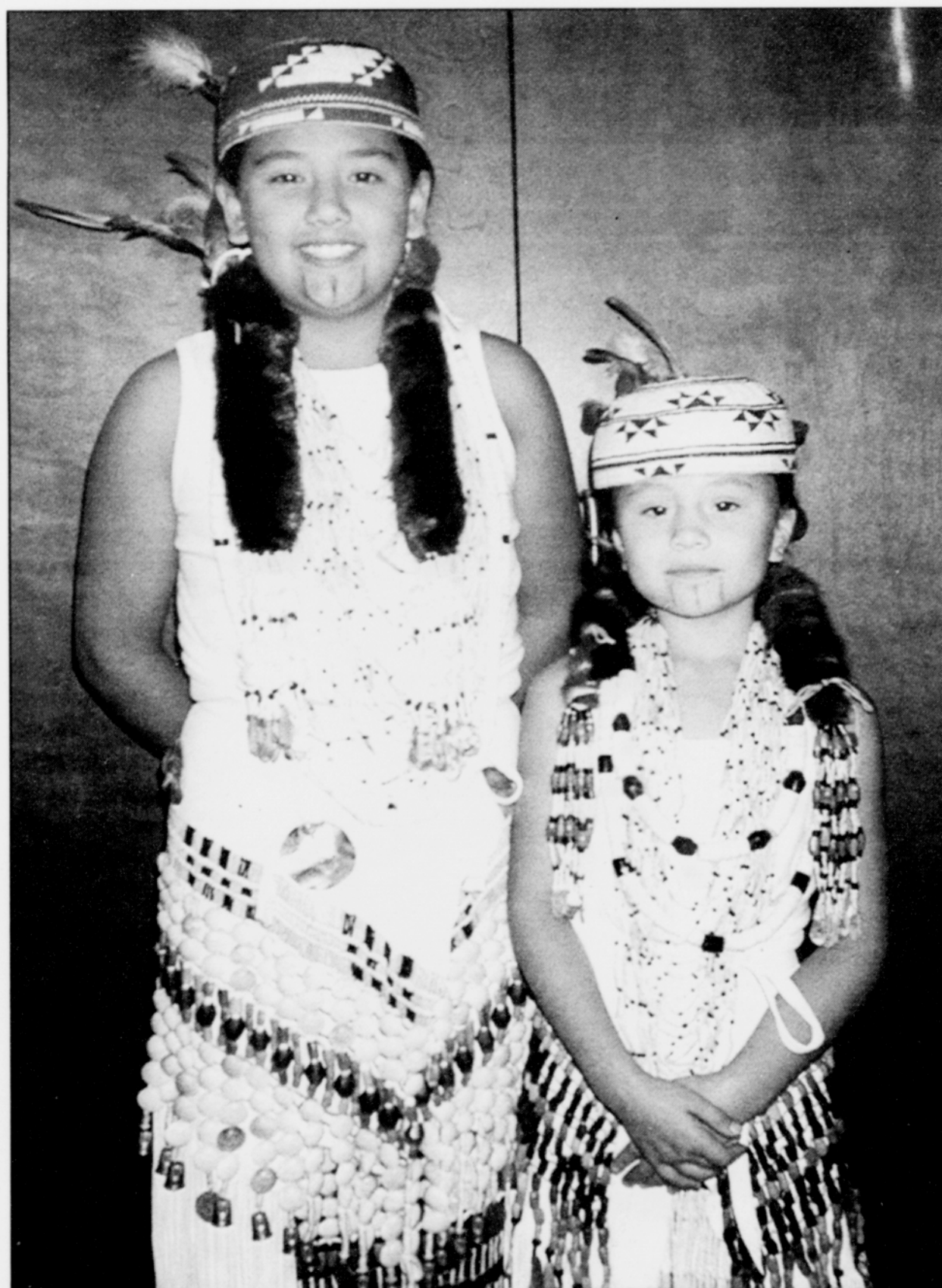
