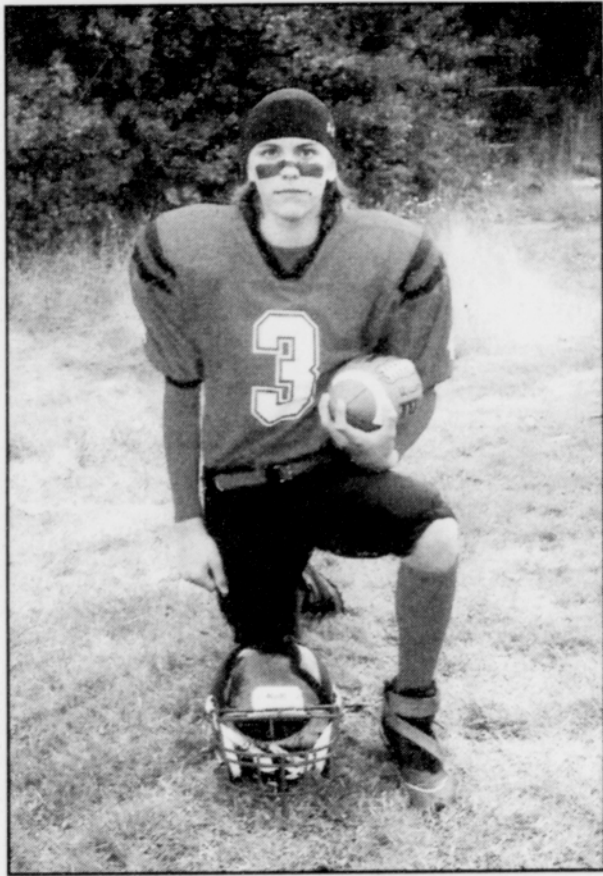

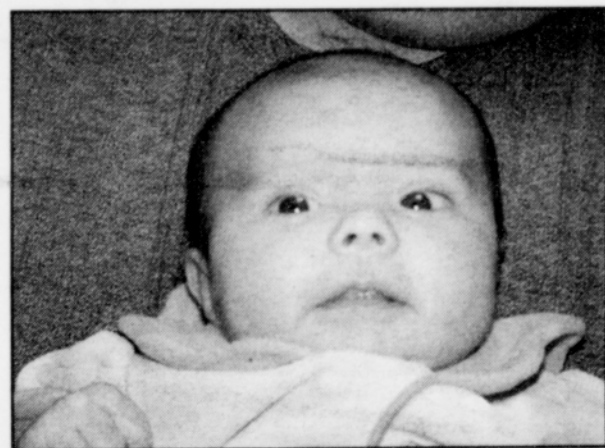

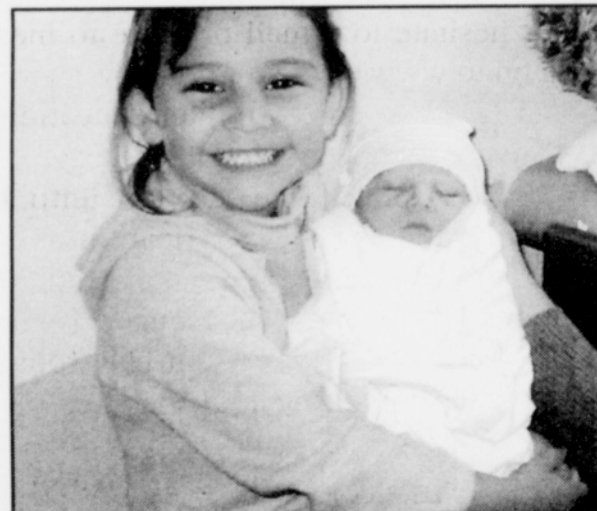
Allivea Marie Hernandez

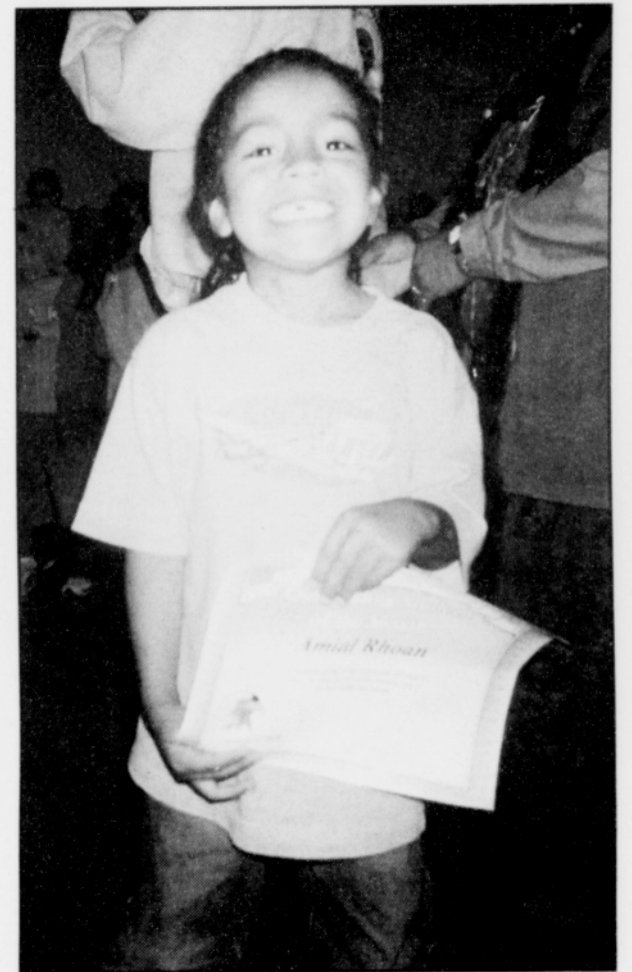
Lincoln Josiah Lewelling
