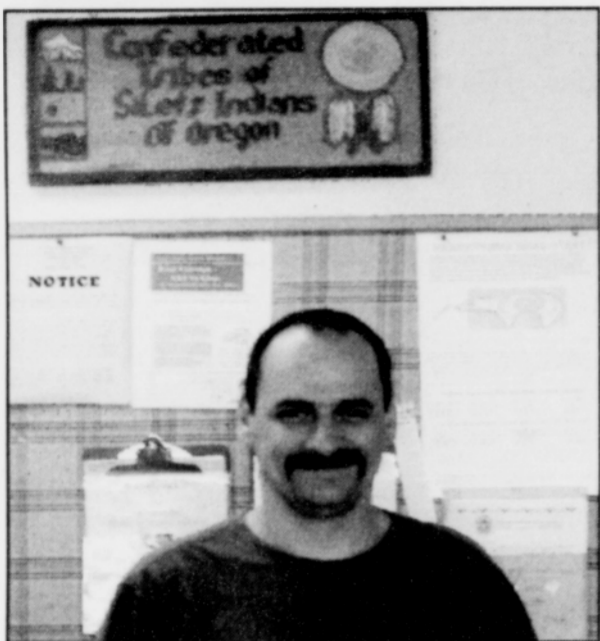

Congratulations, Doug - we are very proud of you. Here's wishing you a bright future and good fortune in all of your endeavors.

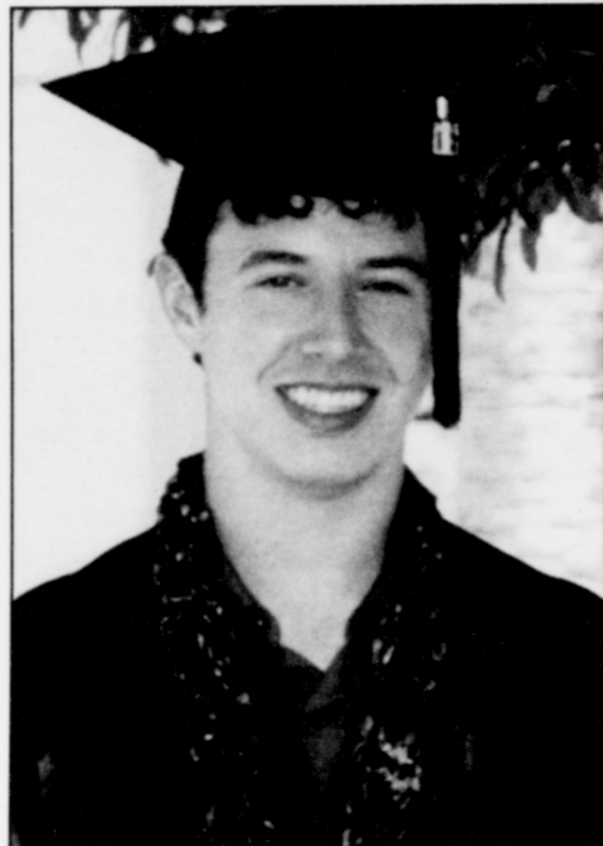

Butler Boys Win Wrestling Awards

Four members of the Siletz Warriors Mat Club participated in the Oregon State Freestyle and Greco Wrestling Championships held in Hermiston on April 21-22.

Issac Butler, 6 years old and a 70-pound Bantam, finished his season as the Freestyle state champion. He also took third in Collegiate State and wrestled in the Oregon Classic in Redmond.

Bobby Butler, 8 years old and a 60-pound Midget, took second in Freestyle and fifth in Greco. He had 38 wins this season, wrestled in the Oregon Classic,

and will compete at the Western Regional Tournament this June in Klamath Falls.

Logan Butler, 10 years old and an 80-pound Novice, placed fifth in Freestyle and third in Greco. Logan will compete in the Western Regional Tournament.
