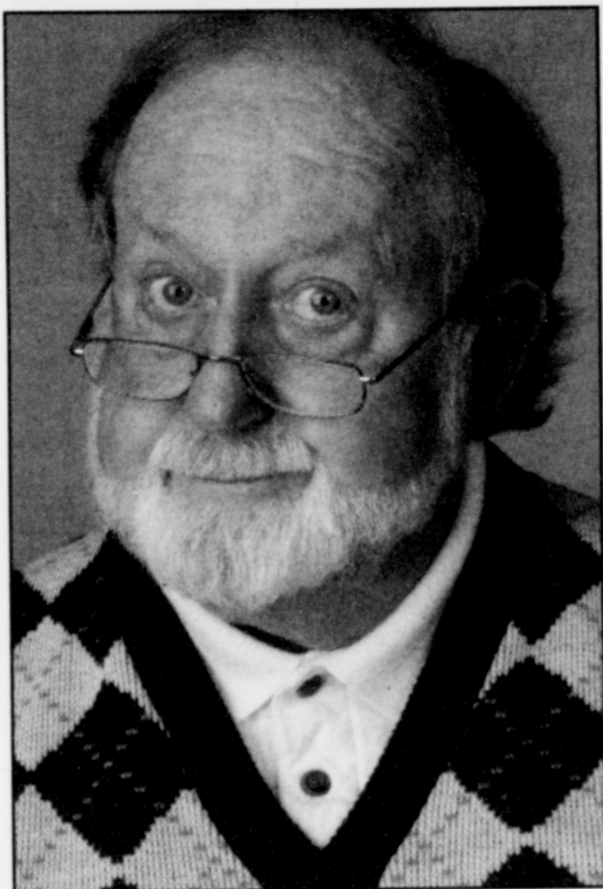

Kenny Bob Davis is well-acquainted with Oregon audiences. He has opened for Larry Gatlin at the Lincoln County Fair and was the producer of the first Pacific Northwest Comedy Competition.

He started his career in show business as a guitar-playing folk singer in the '60s. In 1978, thanks to Eddie Rabbitt, Davis started a new phase of his career by becoming an opening-act comedian.

Since then, he has opened for Kenny Rogers, Alabama, and Larry Gatlin. Davis' television and movie

credits include *Mad TV*, *Gremlins* and *Murder She Wrote*.

Whether you know it or not, you probably have seen **Tim Haldeman**. The actor/stand-up comic has performed in more than 100 television shows and movies.

Among his many credits are appearances on *The West Wing*, *Malcolm in the Middle*, *ER*, *The Drew Carey Show*, *Sabrina the Teenage Witch* and *Third Rock from the Sun*. Over the last decade, Haldeman has developed a stand-up routine that he has performed across the country, including at The Sahara in Las Vegas and at the Atlantis Hotel in Atlantic City.

Michael Pace's facial expressions and punch lines have been compared to Silly Putty and Sunday comic strips. So it's no surprise that he has had audiences across the country laughing in the aisles at The Improv, The Icehouse and the Comedy Store.

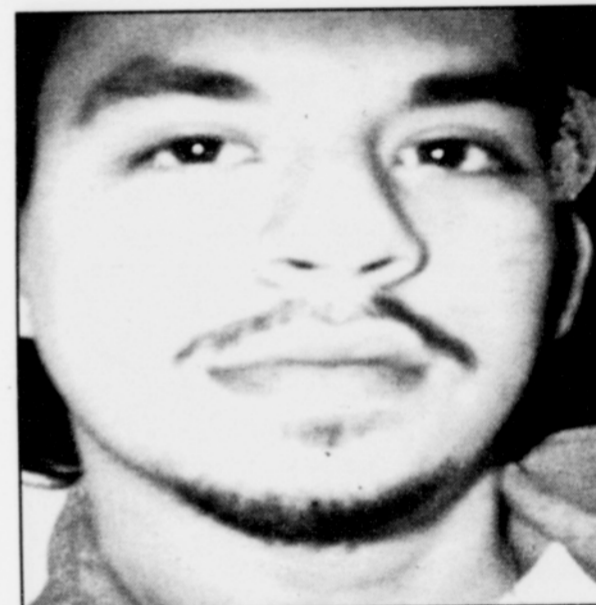

Randy Travis Live in Concert

Country music superstar Randy Travis is bringing his hit music live to Chinook Winds on Aug. 24-25. He has won numerous country music awards for his hit songs including *On The Other Hand*, *Three Wooden Crosses* and many more.

Turned down by nearly every record label in Nashville, often more than once, he finally was signed to Warner Brothers Records in 1985. Record company executives changed his name to Travis and his first recorded effort for his new label was *Prairie Rose*, on the soundtrack to the film *Rustler's Rhapsody*.

It was followed by the release of the album *Storms of Life* in 1986, and the rest is country music history. The first single, *On the Other Hand*, was a perfect slice of Travis' authentic country talent.

1982 followed and with that hit, Travis established himself as a singer and performer in the grand tradition of George Jones, Lefty Frizzell, Merle Haggard and a handful of others. The success of both singles led to widespread demand for live shows, and Travis next set out on an extensive tour that took him across the United States and Canada before record-setting crowds.

Soon it seemed every award in the music business had Travis' name on it. A string of country chart-toppers ensued and by the end of the decade, his record sales topped 13 million copies.

During a break from touring in 1991, Travis married his longtime manager and friend, Lib Hatcher, in a quiet ceremony on the island of Maui, Hawaii.

In September 1997, after 12 albums with Warner Brothers, Travis was the first artist to sign with the newly formed DreamWorks Records label in Nashville. When *Out of My Bones*, the first single from the new label's debut album, *You and You Alone*, was released in 1998, he delivered the label its first No. 1 country hit. In 2001, he independently released a live concert album, *Randy Travis Live*, and a CD single, *America Will Always Stand*.

In 2003, Travis was awarded the Christian Country Music Association's Mainstream Country Artist of the Year award. That same year, his Word Records/Curb/Warner Bros. album *Rise*

and *Shine* was awarded a Dove Award for Country Album of the Year and the single *Three Wooden Crosses* won the Christian Country Music Association's Song of the Year award.

Three Wooden Crosses also won the 2003 CMA Award for Song of the Year and had the distinction of being the only song from a Christian label to ever make it to No. 1 on the country charts.

In 2004, Travis' *Rise and Shine* album was honored again with a Grammy for Best Southern, Country, or Bluegrass, Gospel Album. His single, *Three Wooden Crosses*, won the ACM Song of the Year award and a Dove Award for Country Recorded Song of the Year. Also in 2004, his traditional hymns album, *Worship & Faith*, won a Dove Award for Country Album of the Year.

In 2005, Travis received a Grammy for Best Southern, Country, or Bluegrass, Gospel Album for *Worship & Faith*. In April 2006, he won a Dove Award for Country Album of the Year for his Word Records/Curb/Warner Bros. album of traditional hymns, *Glory Train*.

2006 also found Randy back on the big screen, this time in a thriller, *The Visitation*, from 20th Century Fox. The film was directed by Robby Henson and is based on the New York Times bestselling novel by Frank Peretti.

Show time is 8 p.m. Tickets are \$35 to \$60.
