Eligible Students: American Indian residents of Oregon who attend or are planning to attend an accredited trade or vocational school in Oregon.

Awards: \$1,500-\$3,000 per year. Students can apply and compete for the scholarship for up to four years.

Criteria:

- Aptitude for a particular trade or vocation
- Strong work ethic and good moral character; dependable and responsible
- Participation in school or community activities

- Academic promise
- Certification of tribal enrollment

Deadline: Applications are accepted at OCF between Jan. 1 and March 1 each year, for a scholarship for the next academic year.

The City of Portland wishes to invite you to participate in what we hope will be an annual Native American Marketplace. This year it's being held at the Portland Building and will be promoted to all city employees and be open to any other people who wish to attend.

This event is a highlight of November's Native American Heritage Month celebration. We are seeking enrolled (per 1990 IACL) Native American artisans to bring their crafts to sell for the one-day event on Nov. 29, 2007, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Important vendor information:

- Booth space contract and terms and conditions (includes setup and tear down times) must be fully filled out and **returned by Nov. 8.**
- Portland/Multnomah County Business License information and forms (available at www.pdxbl.org): You must do one of the following:
- Provide business license **account number OR** provide **copy of Annual Exemption** form (check **Other** box and write **H2** on line for this event). Use this if you are doing less than 14 days of business in Portland/Multnomah County within the tax year. This cannot be filled out online - it must be done in person or through the mail. **OR**
- Provide **copy of business license application** or some proof that application and fee has been taken care of. You will want to get a Portland/Multnomah County business license if you will be doing business for 14 days or more within the tax year. Use a business start date close to the date of the application; for example, if you apply on Sept 30, use a date like Oct 1. Do not use Nov. 29 as the start date as the License Bureau will reject it because it's too far into the future. Fee for the business license is \$100 and is best to do online.

Vendor setup will be 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. and tear down 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. We have 16 booth spaces that are approximately 8' x 8'. One 6-foot table and two chairs will be provided. Limited outlets are available, so please let us know if you will need one. Your parking will be validated if you park in a SmartPark garage.

Scholarship Announcement for Native American/Alaska Native Natural Resource Students

Deadline: March 31, 2008, 5 p.m.

Award: \$2,000 for college students (number of awards varies per year); **\$1,500** for graduating senior high school students

Purpose: The **Truman D. Picard Scholarship Program** is dedicated to the support of Native American students pursuing higher education in natural resources.

Required Materials: The Education Selection Committee will review and rank those applicants who completely address each area. Please be specific. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Letter of Application: The letter must include your name, permanent mailing address, e-mail address if available, phone number, be a maximum of two pages in length and discuss the following:

- Interest in natural resources
- Commitment to education, community and your culture
- Financial need. Students who have completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should attach the Student Aid Report or have the report sent to the ITC office.

Résumé

Three signed **letters of reference**, preferably on letterhead.

Evidence of validated enrollment in a tribe or Native Alaska Corporation, as listed in the Federal Register/Vol. 70, Nov. 25, 2005/Notices.

A photocopy of your enrollment card, front and back, is sufficient.

Transcripts. All students must include transcripts.

- High school students also must include documented proof of acceptance to an institution of higher education.
- College students also must provide proof of their declared major.
