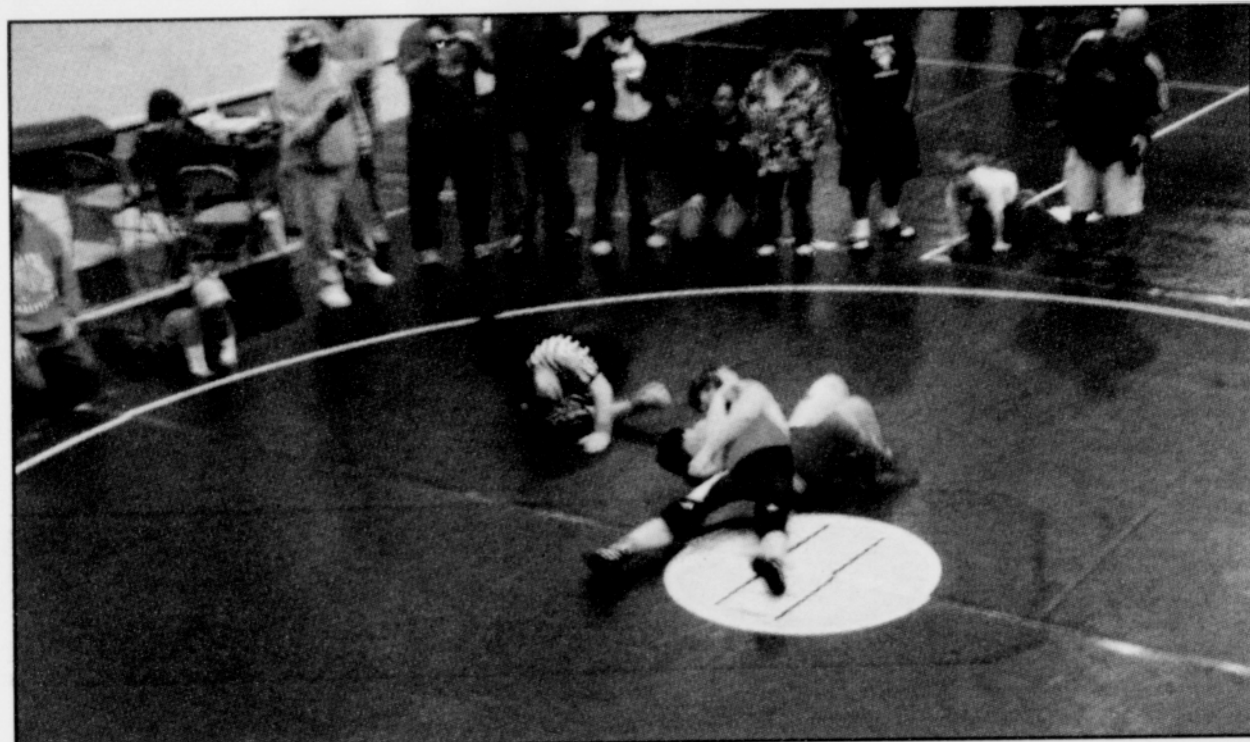

Robert "Bobby" Lee Bayya, 55, of Siletz, Ore., passed away at his home on Jan. 29, 2008, with his family at his side.

Bobby was born in Toledo, Ore., on June 15, 1952, to Simon "Sam" and Lillian (Lawson) Bayya.

He was a lifetime resident of Siletz and attended Siletz School. He spent many years working for the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians. He had been employed at the tribe's lumber mill and most recently worked in the tribal maintenance department.

Bobby enjoyed life. He was passionate about everything he did. He loved hunting, mud bogging, drag racing and the outdoors. Mostly he enjoyed people – children, family and friends. He was a mentor, coach and umpire for youth baseball, T-ball through major league, including girls softball.

On Nov. 27, 1997, Bobby married his life companion, Karen Wood, in Siletz. He and Karen shared 17 years together.

He was a member of the Siletz Tribe and co-founder and member of the Tillicum Cancer Support Group in Siletz.

Robert Lee Bayya was preceded in death by his parents, Simon and Lillian Bayya; brother, Douglas Bayya; and sister-in-law, Sheila Bayya.
