In June 2007, Laura Hamilton was hired as the library manager. In November 2007, Darci Adolf and Shelley Glaze joined her. Each one brings a unique talent and looks forward to helping the library and the community.

Laura's background starts with a profound love of libraries. She first stated her desire to be a librarian as a child, when her jaw dropped after a librarian asked if she wanted a job there when she grew up.

"I had no idea one could be paid to spend time in libraries," she remembers.

An avid reader, she worked at the library at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, Calif., where she got her degree in English. After beginning a graduate course of study toward a library degree at San Jose State, she quit to get married and have a family. She worked at a small branch library in Santa Clara, Calif., for three years before her twin sons were born.

"Raising them got me interested in education and I've been working in homeschooling programs and alternative education (13 years) and as a writing teacher at the community college level (eight years) before moving to Newport last year. I now continue to teach in an online format for Rogue Community College and enjoy that very much."

Laura looks forward to seeing you and assisting you on your library visit.

"Whether you dash in to grab some essential piece of information or have the leisure to more fully make use of the objects stored here, I'm happy to help connect you with what you seek," says Laura, "If you haven't yet seen the new library, I will be happy to show you around and get a card set up for you. Darci grew up in Camas, Wash. She graduated from Clark College in Vancouver, Wash., earning an associate's degree with an emphasis on data processing.

She spent five years in the U.S. Air Force as a computer specialist. After receiving a B.S. in management and an M.B.A., she worked a variety of jobs before pursuing her librarian degree full time in November 2005.

"I received my MLIS degree in June 2007 from the University of Washington. My emphasis was in instruction and training. I completed two internships during my studies, one at UC Berkeley's Bancroft Library and one working with Librarian Kathy Searless at OCCC," said Darci.

Shelley grew up loving libraries. Receiving her first library card at age 4, she was encouraged by her family.

"My parents felt that it was essential to be able to use one's imagination to the fullest and books were the perfect entry to the power of our minds," Shelley explained.

Boarding schools in Georgia and Massachusetts exposed her even further to literature.

Knowing she was destined to be a lifelong learner but not knowing what that would mean for a career, she decided to study philosophy. In 2003, she graduated from the University of Portland with a B.A. She majored in philosophy and minored in education.

"For me, philosophy and education had the same building blocks, the same foundation, the same core. I was drawn to both. By the end of my time at the University of Portland, I knew I wanted to teach," Shelley said.

She taught kindergarten at a small private school.

"I loved creating a literacy-rich classroom community. I also knew if I wanted to be the best teacher I could be, I simply needed more education myself," she said.

She went on to get her master's in education from Lewis and Clark College. She loved her time there and finished the program in August 2006.

"I am really looking forward to partnering with Siletz Valley School to encourage the love of literacy in Siletz. I hope my love of literature is contagious! I am excited about working at the Siletz library and getting to know the people of Siletz. Please stop by and say hi!"

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that a petition for **Petition for Child Support** has been filed with the Warm Springs Tribal Court.

By this notice you are summoned to appear in this matter at a hearing scheduled for the **11th day of March, 2008, 3:00 PM** at the Warm Springs Tribal Court. All of the facts of the case will be heard at this hearing, including evidence you wish to present.

You must appear to present your argument or the other side will automatically win. The Petitioner, **Arlissa Rhoan**, may then be given all that is asked for in the petition for **Petition for Child Support**.

Both parties of this action may be represented by counsel, or may elect to represent themselves. If you cannot be present, you may have your approved legal counsel appear on your behalf at your own expense. Representation must be approved by presiding judge to ensure the rules governing admissibility to practice are met. Therefore, a spokesperson form must be submitted at least 5 days prior to the hearing.

If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately. Failure to obtain legal counsel prior to the hearing is not sufficient cause to rescheduled hearing.
