PGE's Student Summer Hire Program Applications Accepted Through May 2, 2008

Positions are at various PGE locations and are 40 hours a week. Jobs usually start in June and end in September. Position types include:

- Engineering (all disciplines)

- Information Technology

PGE's program is designed to assist students with their college costs, provide work experience and introduce students to utility careers. To qualify, you must be:

- A full-time (a minimum of 12 credit hours) college student who is returning to college or trade school in the fall of 2008

Advocates Sought to Serve Long-Term Care Residents

Volunteer advocates and investigators are needed to serve as ombudsmen for residents of nursing homes, residential care facilities, assisted living facilities and adult foster care homes.

The Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman will train the volunteers on the aging process, communication skills, problem-solving skills, investigation and other ombudsman skills. The certification training begins April 2 in Salem, Ore.

As certified ombudsmen, volunteers work to improve the quality of

residents' lives by identifying and investigating complaints and concerns on behalf of the residents, then working with the facilities to make changes.

The typical concerns ombudsmen address cover a broad range and often include resident care; residents' rights, such as privacy, respect and dignity; and quality of life concerns such as appropriate activities and meals.

"The volunteers make a tremendous difference in the lives of the residents," says Kathy Walter, program administrator. "They are well-prepared and effective."

Superintendent Susan Castillo's Youth Advisory Team, a diverse group of Oregon students who play an active role in changing and improving public education in the state, is seeking new members.

Castillo meets with the team five times a year to address specific educational concerns. The superintendent currently is looking for six to 10 new members for the team. Preference will be given to 11th and 12th graders, but eighth-graders through college freshmen are allowed to apply.

Members must be ready to take on the challenge of advising the superintendent of public instruction based on

their experiences in the public school system. The team's recommendations are considered by the superintendent and forwarded on to legislators, state board members and other education policy makers, often resulting in key policy implementations.

Castillo embraces the idea of giving students a way to voice their concerns about Oregon's educational future. Past members have spoken highly of their experience on the team.

Members must attend eight quarterly meetings in Salem over a two-year period and should have an interest in using their personal experiences to advise the superintendent and other state leaders, students, educators and community members.

Students who will be seniors next year will only be asked to attend one year of meetings, however, for anyone else it's a two-year requirement. There are four to five meetings a year.

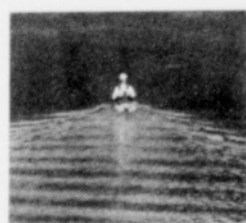

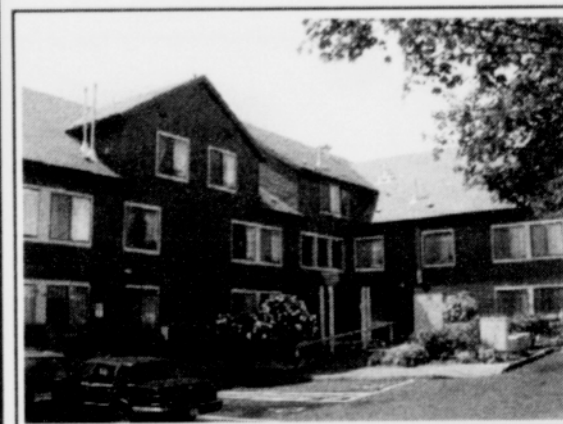
