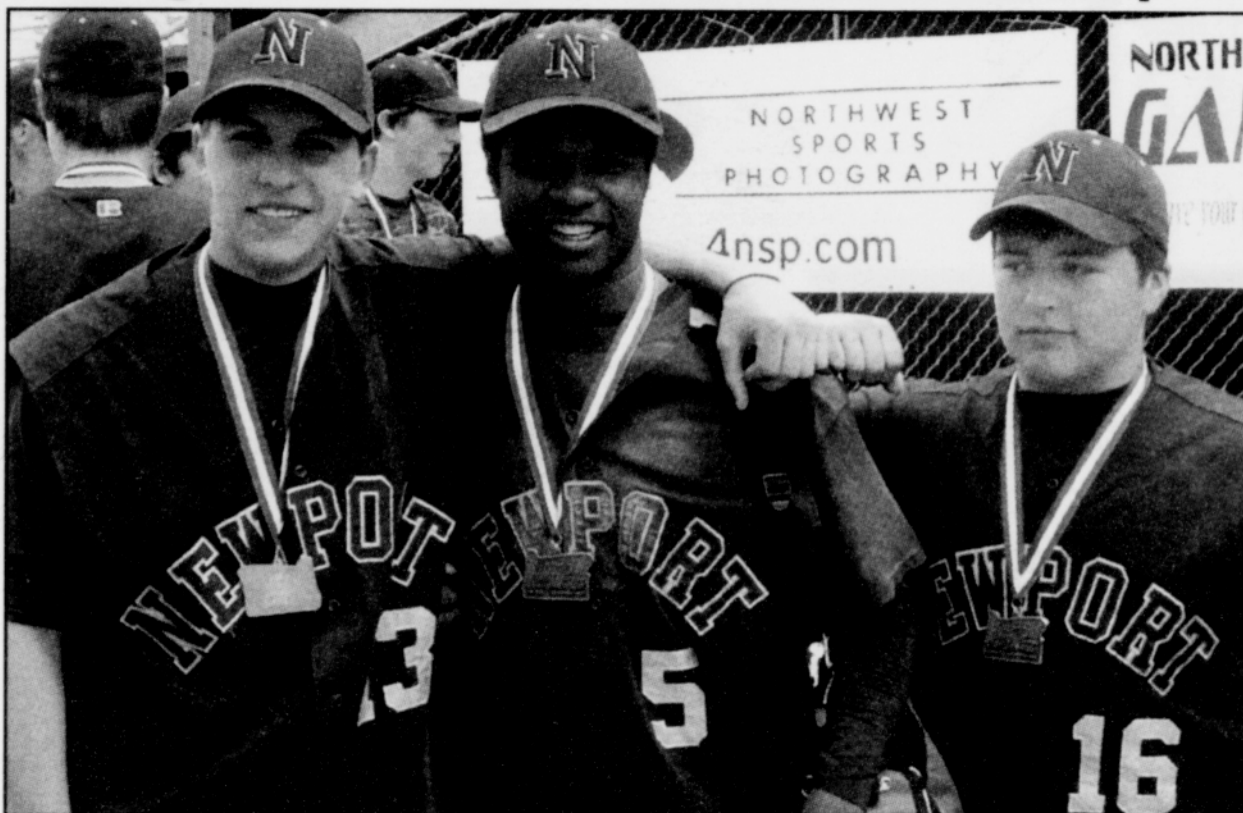


Congrats to State Baseball Champs!

Also in May, Tristan played baseball for the Newport Cubs (his high school) along with Casee Case and Brett Lane. Newport won the 4A state championship.

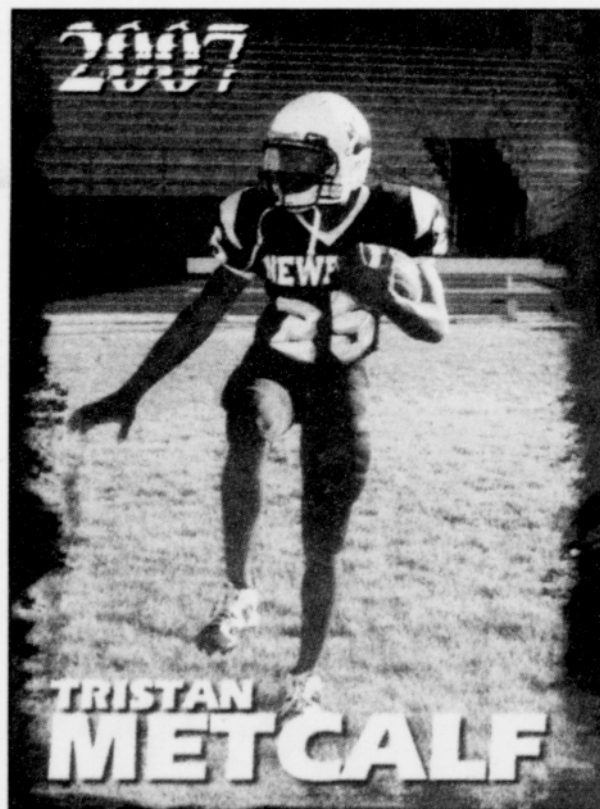
