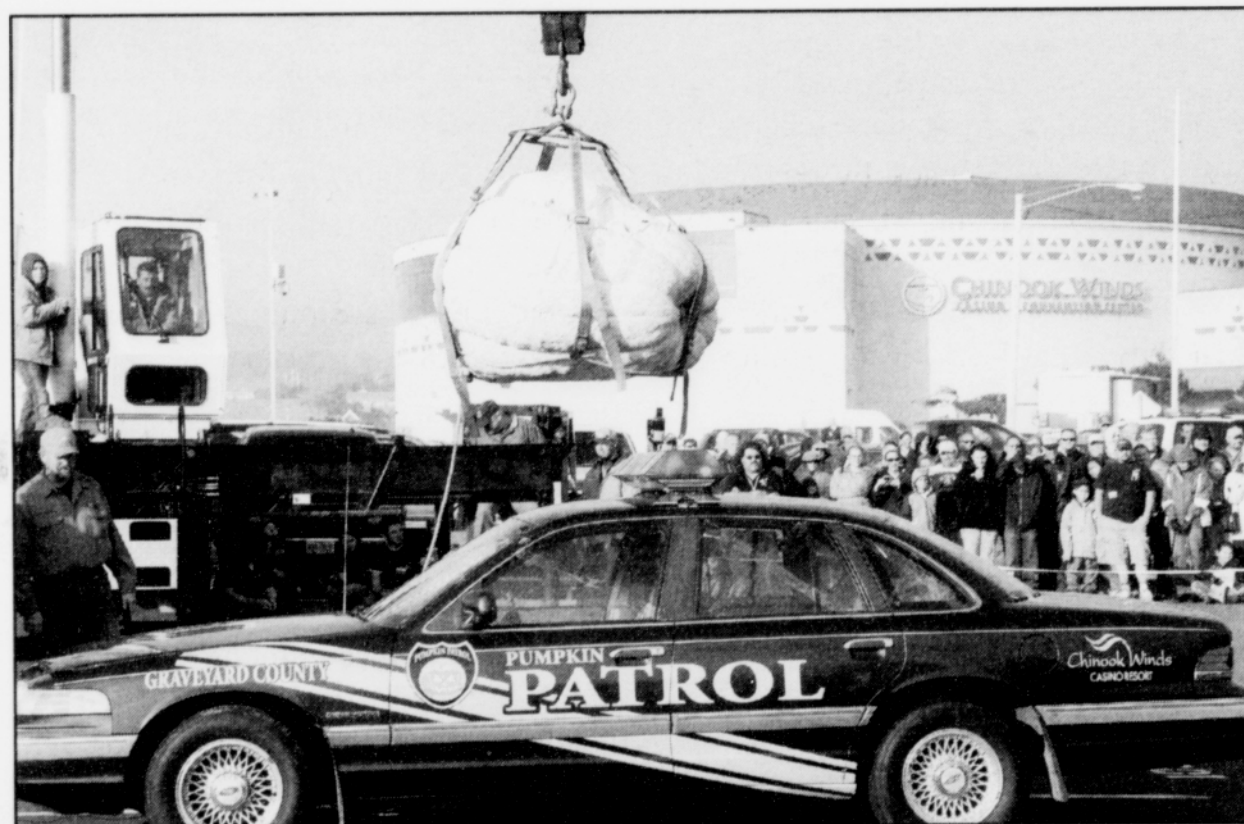

## Giant Vegetables on Display as Pumpkins Drop from the Sky

\$10,000 in prizes are to be had by  
giant vegetables (and their growers)  
who are coming to Chinook Winds for  
the Eighth Annual Terminator Weigh-  
Off on Oct. 18 at noon.

The Pacific Giant Vegetable Grow-  
ers (PGVG) return to Chinook Winds  
year after year to display their monster  
vegetables. The winning pumpkin in  
2007 weighed in at 1,370.5 pounds and  
was grown by Steve Daletas of Pleas-  
ant Hill, Ore.

In addition to the competition,  
there will be a chance to raise money  
for the Lincoln County Sheriff's Posse.

Pumpkins will drop from the sky  
at 4 p.m. One enormous pumpkin will  
plummet to the earth after being sus-  
pended from a crane, held aloft in mid-  
air and released on a tricked out car as  
its final destination.

The Sheriff's Posse will give tours  
of their mobile sheriff's unit and will  
answer questions on what their orga-  
nization does for the community.

Wear a costume or bring a carved  
pumpkin and you could win cash! From  
10 a.m. until 4 p.m., we will register  
entrants in our first costume contest and  
second annual carved pumpkin contest.  
Stop by the Terminator Tent on the ca-  
sino grounds for more information.

Everyone is invited to get a closer  
look at the enormous squash and root  
for their favorite at the weigh-in. The  
Terminator Weigh-Off will be held out-  
side the casino. There is no admission  
fee and the event is open to all ages.

First place will receive \$1,500, sec-  
ond \$1,250 and third \$1,000. Cash  
prizes will be given out to 30<sup>th</sup> place,  
as well as \$2,500 in lodging and enter-  
tainment prizes.
