How to Use Two Features on the CTSI Website

Some requests have been made about two aspects of the website – how to maneuver through the website and how to enter search words into the search engine.

Located at the bottom of each page is a footer. Within the footer is a link called "Site Map." This link will display all the pages contained within the CTSI website. Site maps are very useful tools to navigate within a website that contains a lot of information. Once the pages are displayed, click on the desired page.

Another area of concern is the website search engine. The search engine is located just above the footer on the left side of the page. Search engines allow the user to search the website with various words that the user types in.

Click within the white box and type in a search word. The search engine will display the pages that contain the search word on a single page. You then can click on the page to have the full content appear in the browser.

Exercise some care when using search engines. If your search word is too general, many pages will be displayed. Try to be specific.
