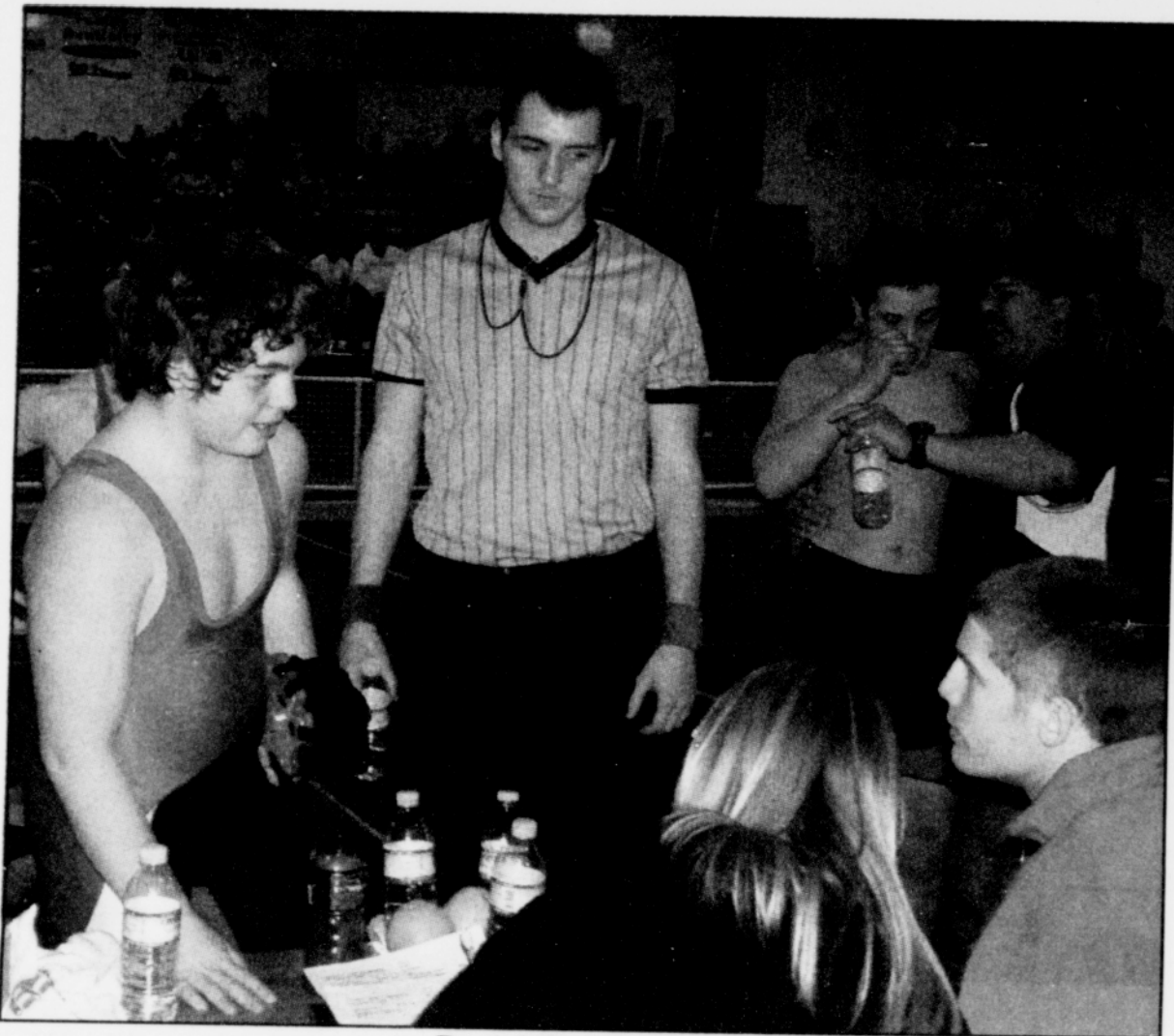

During the seven years Daniel has been wrestling, he has gained a wealth of experience from the coaches who have helped him along his path.

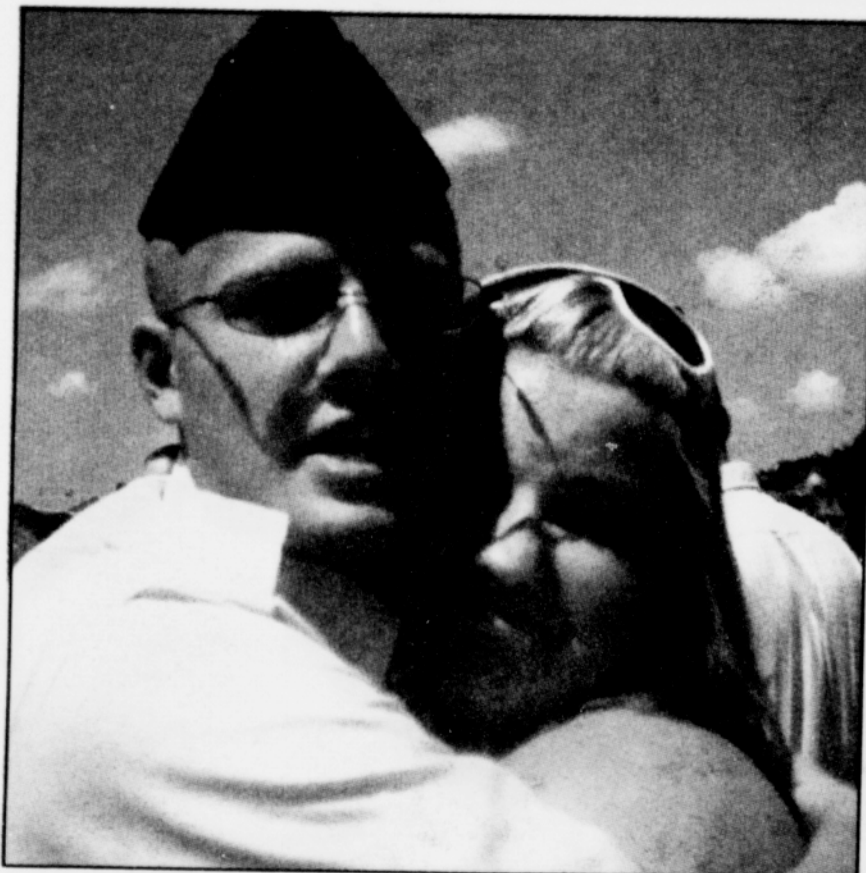
"This competition will be a great experience for Daniel to meet and learn new things

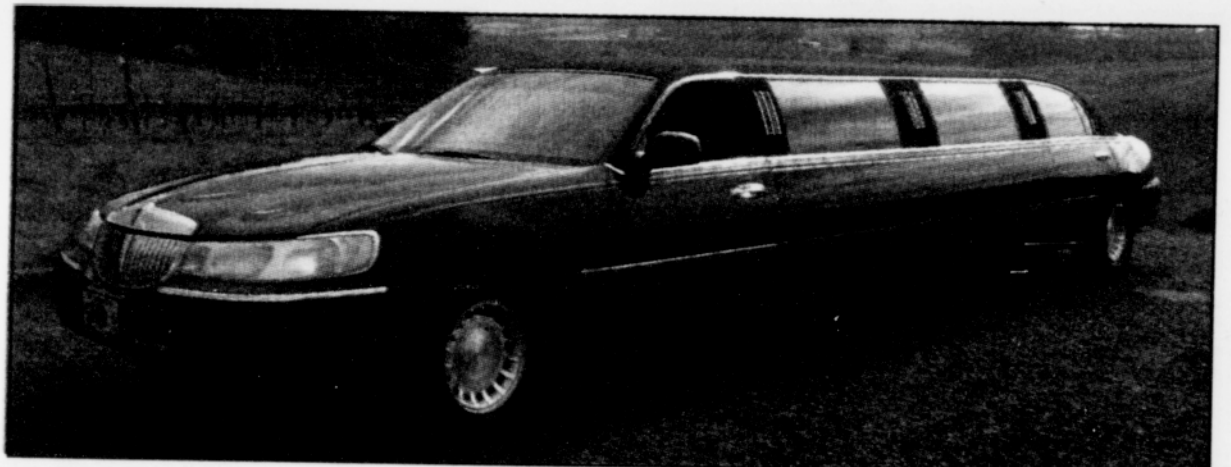
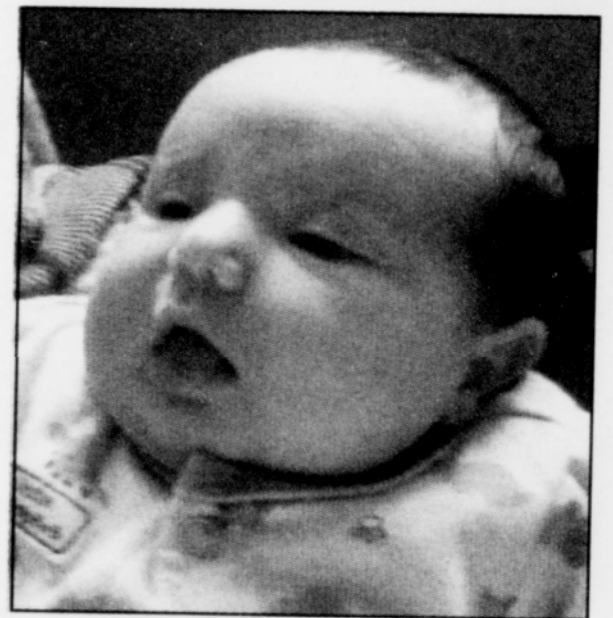
Rocky LaChance and his bride Melissa at graduation from boot camp in San Antonio, Texas (photo from Mama LaChance)

"We would now like to offer the Tribe our services for airport transfers, meetings

and events in the Portland-metro area. We also can quote out transportation for other locations, such as Lincoln City or Siletz," said Kristina.

Kristina and Christopher are working with Tim Glaze at Chinook Winds to start providing for its transportation needs for entertainers, events and VIPs. They are working hard to pay back a Tribal business loan for a past business in Arizona.

Entourage International has Town Car sedans, limousines and a mini-bus, plus Kristina and Christopher work with many affiliate companies if they do not carry the vehicle you require.

"Please let us know if we may be of service to you. We look forward to taking care of the transportation needs of Chinook Winds and the Siletz Tribe," said Kristina.
