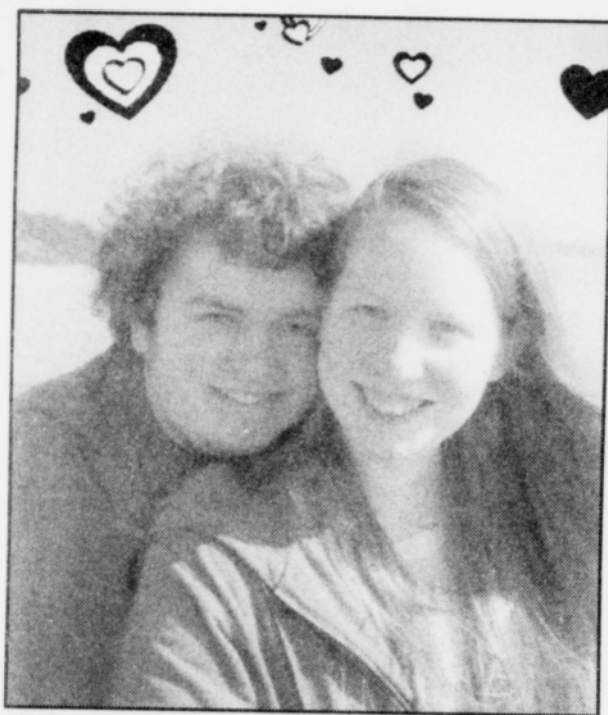




Briggs, Devenberg to Marry, Continue Studies at WOU

Both of their families wish them the very best!



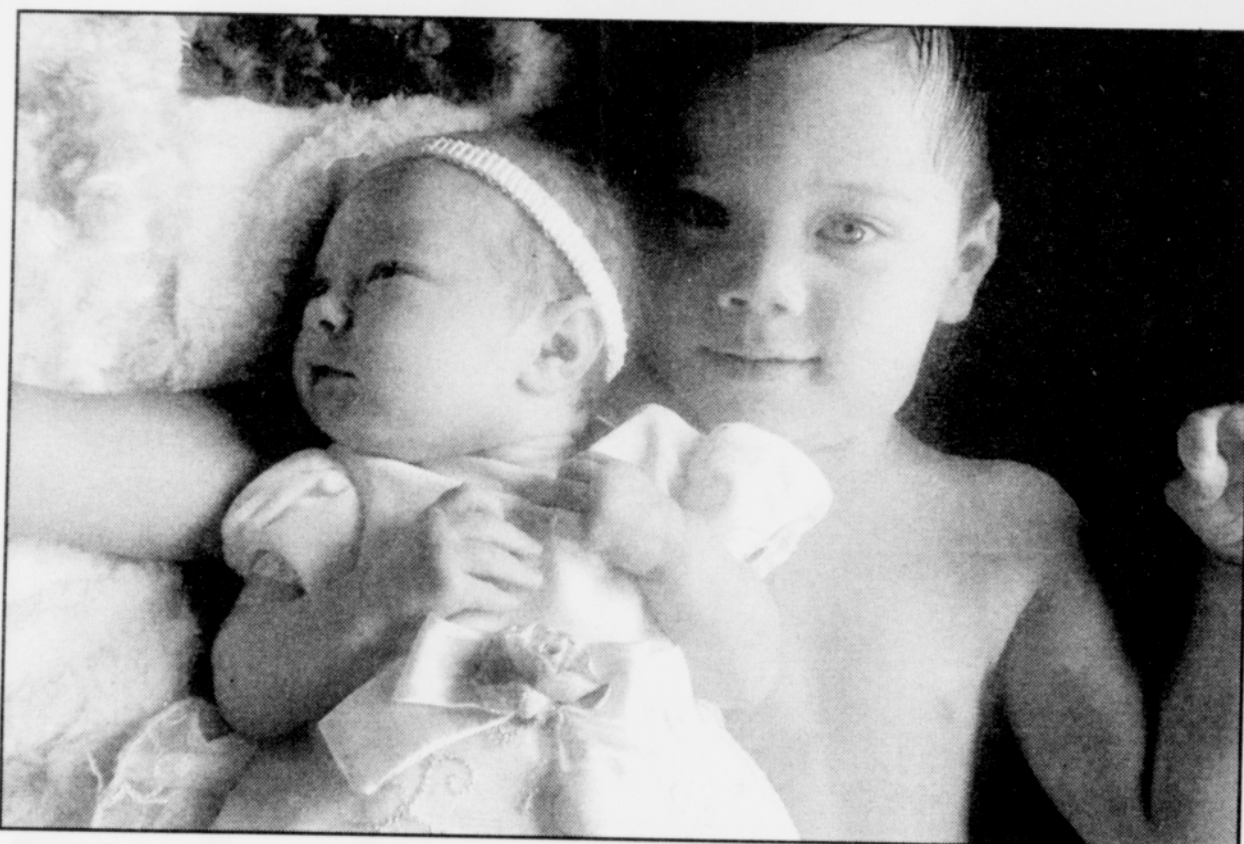
Connor Dore' Mason
