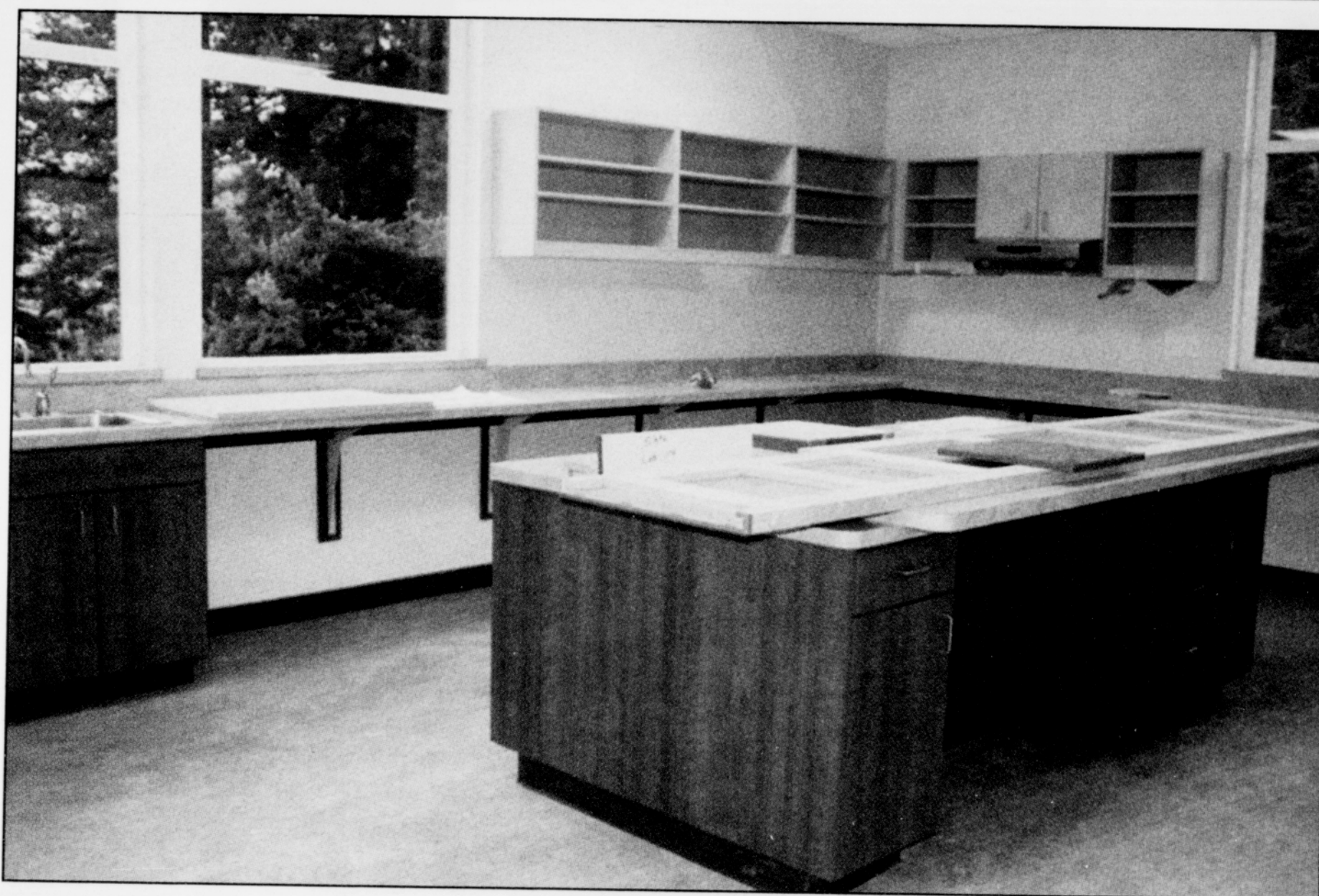




New Clinic to Open in May, Months Ahead of Schedule

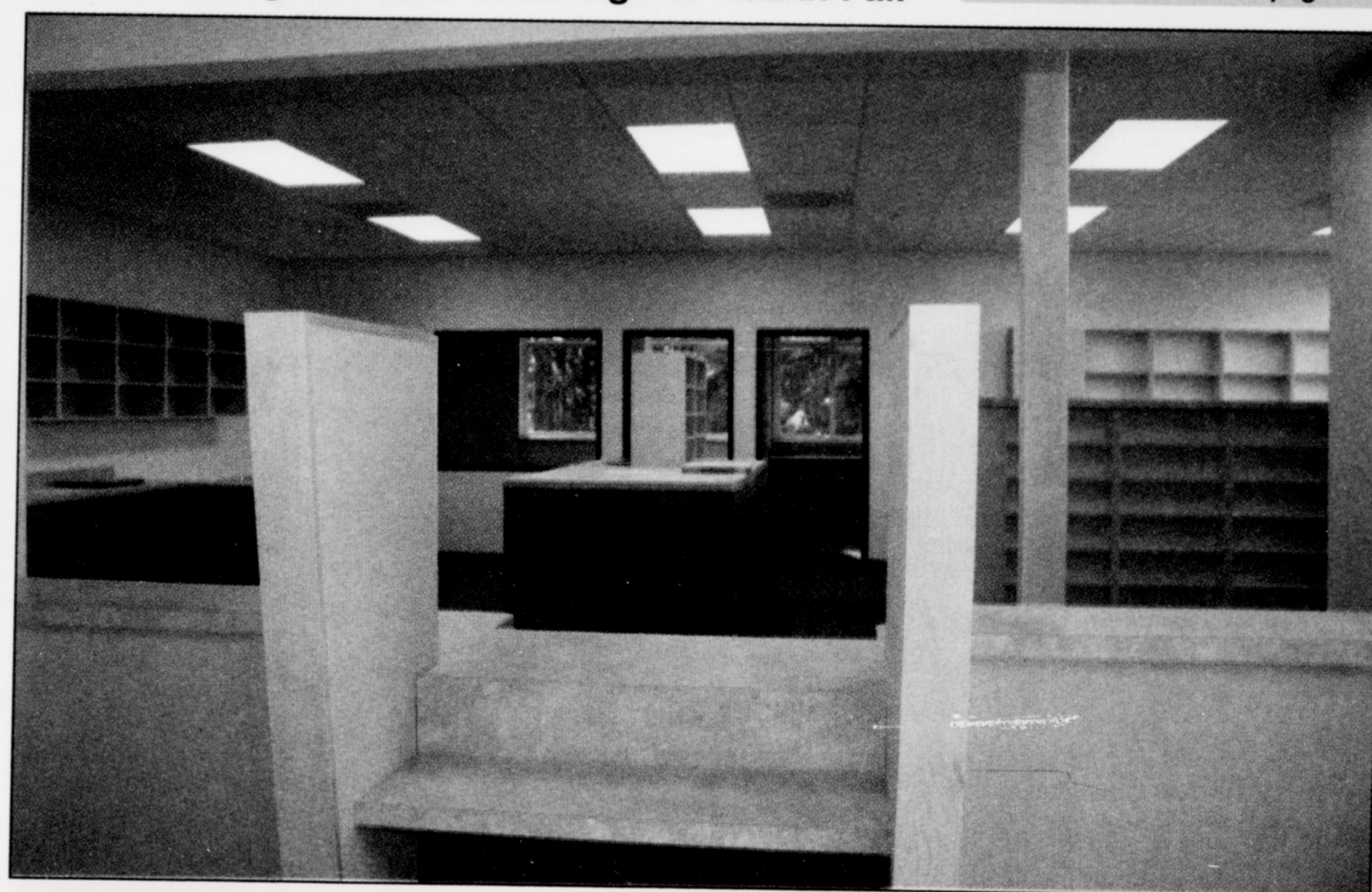
This fair is for adults and supervised children and will have lots of free health screening opportunities, information from several area companies and lots of giveaways and raffle prizes.
