The area was scheduled to be logged for campus development, so it was a good opportunity to gather the root while it was still accessible.

The weather was on their side as it turned out to be a beautiful day. After the spruce root was collected, it was boiled in a canner and peeled. The root will be used for various basketry projects.

It was a fun day for everyone. Tribal members had the opportunity to get some exercise, gained knowledge about gathering spruce root and enjoyed communing with other Tribal members.
