History Book Available First to Tribal Members on Two Days in November

Tribal ID required for Tribal members to pick one up

The People Are Dancing Again, the book about Siletz Tribal history written by Charles Wilkinson, will be available to Tribal members on Nov. 19 and 20.

In order to attempt to minimize the crush of people who are expected to pick up books at the Restoration Celebration on Nov. 20, Tribal members can pick up **one** copy of the book at no charge and get it signed by Wilkinson on Nov. 19 from:

- 9 a.m. to noon at the Tribal Community Center in Siletz
- 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in the Siletz Room in the convention center at Chinook Winds Casino Resort

Books (see cover below) also will be available for Tribal members all day at the Restoration Celebration on Nov. 20. Wilkinson will sign copies of the book for Tribal members from 9 a.m. to noon in the Siletz Room.

You **must** have your Tribal ID card on either day to get a book. You **cannot** pick up books for other Tribal members on either day.

Extra Copies or Not a Tribal Member

If you are a Tribal member who would like additional copies or you are not a Tribal member, copies of the book will be available for purchase on Nov. 20 in the Chetco Room in the convention center at Chinook Winds through Canyon Way Bookstore from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. and in the Chinook Winds gift shop, which is open from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. on Saturdays.

At 2 p.m., Wilkinson will join a panel discussion about the book in the Chetco Room that is open to the public. He will sign books here after the presentation until 4 p.m.

Joining Wilkinson in the panel discussion will be Delores Pigsley, Tribal chairman; Bud Lane, Tribal vice chairman and language and traditional arts instructor; and Robert Kentta, Tribal Council member and cultural director.

Wilkinson then will move to the casino lobby and sign books until 5:30 p.m. for Tribal members and the general public. Canyon Way Bookstore also will have books for sale in the casino lobby until 5:30 p.m.
