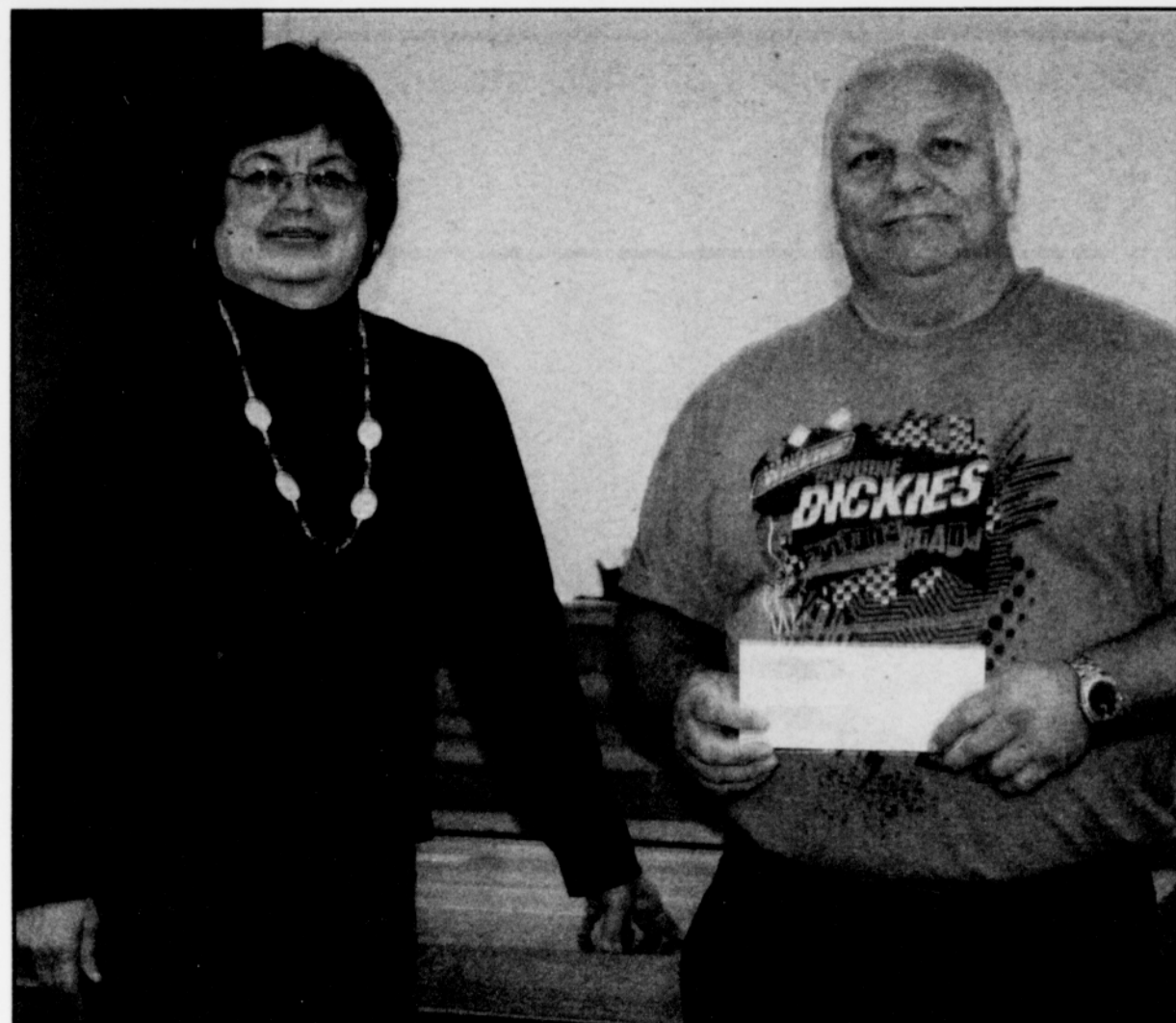

Ellen Louise Metcalf, 59, of Siletz, Ore., died from surgery complications on Oct. 26, 2010, at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center in Corvallis, Ore.

She was born Feb. 16, 1951, to Willard Metcalf Sr. and Clara Palamino in Toledo, Ore. She lived her life to the fullest between the Willamette Valley and Siletz, where she is known for her devotion to her ancestors, family and her many forms of beadwork. She was a spirited woman who was a mother, grandmother and faithful friend to many.

A funeral and celebration of life service was held Oct. 29 at the Siletz Tribal Community Center in Siletz, followed by the final ceremony at the Paul Washington Cemetery and a pot-luck reception.
