Monte was an avid golfer, fisherman, sports fan and adventurer. His favorite pastime was being with his family.

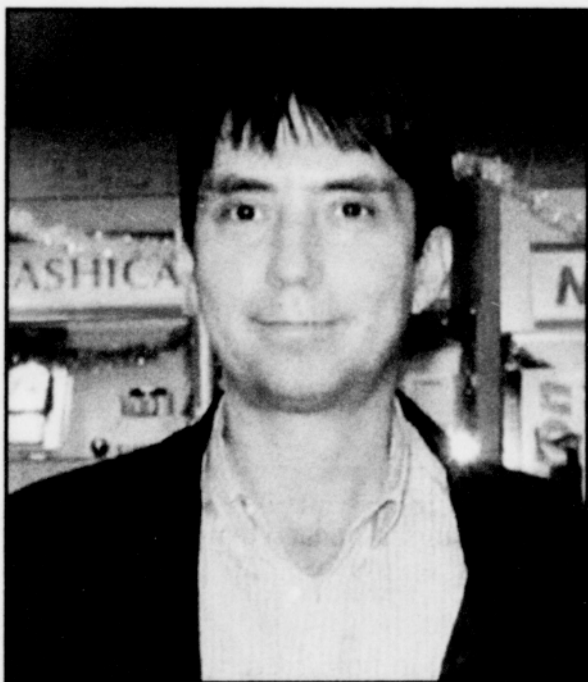
Monte worked as a logger for 15 years after his service in the U.S. Air Force. He changed professions and was a carpenter for the last 17 years of his life.

Junior and Jane returned to Oregon in 1981. Junior worked for Chemawa Indian School in the Willamette Valley until his retirement in 1997.

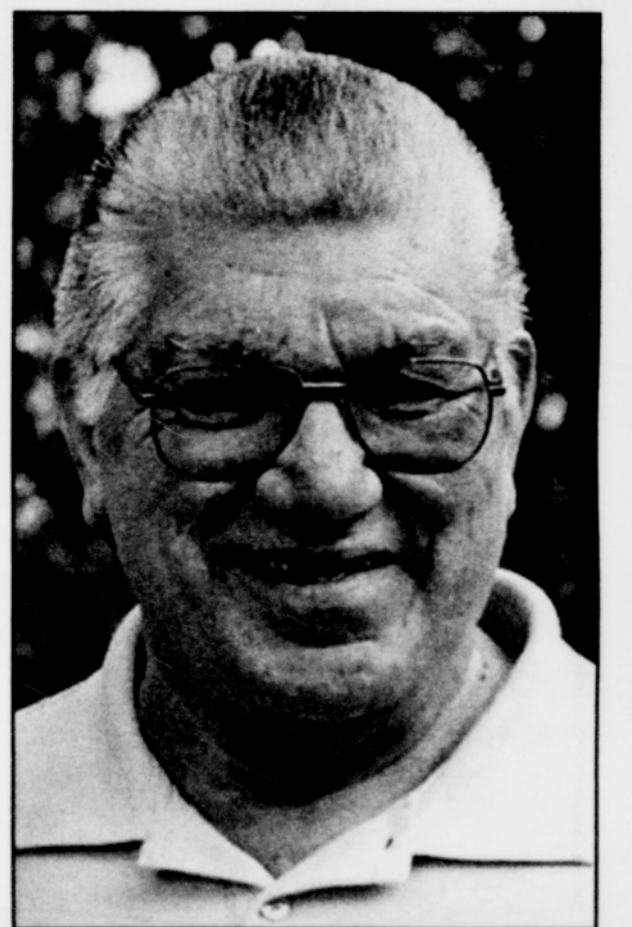
