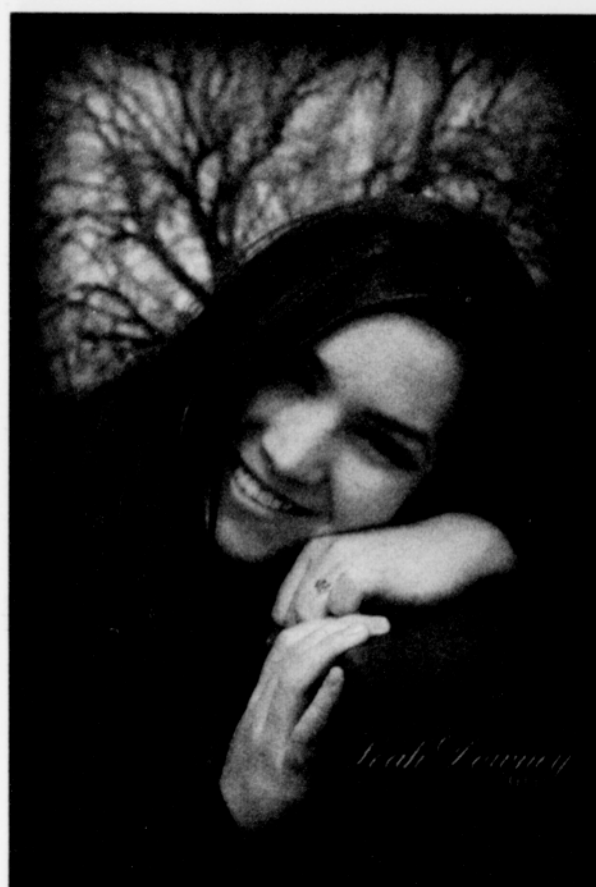
Aria Gray Taft High School

Chambers opens acupuncture practice; can help with variety of ailments

Siletz Tribal member and acupuncturist Jennifer Chambers recently began her acupuncture practice in Northeast Portland and is excited to offer \$50 treatments to all Tribal members. The Tribe reimburses \$50 for acupuncture visits with a doctor's referral, so there would be no additional cost for the Tribal member to cover.

Chambers is a graduate of the Pacific College of Oriental Medicine in New York City, where she received her master's degree in traditional Chinese medicine.

She is continuing her studies and pursuing a doctorate degree from the Oregon College of Oriental Medicine.

Acupuncture has proved to be extremely successful in treating many conditions and ailments. Many people have tried acupuncture as a "last resort" and found that it helped with their complex medical condition when other treatments did not.

Acupuncture also can be used to support the body's immunity and prevent

disease from occurring by promoting health, energy and vitality. For this reason, people often seek out acupuncture when they are basically healthy but would like to have more energy, better focus and concentration throughout the day and to reduce stress.

Many conditions can be treated by acupuncture, including but not limited to allergies, headaches and migraines, arthritis or pain anywhere in the body, high blood pressure, sinusitis, insomnia,

anxiety and depression, gastrointestinal disorders such as irritable bowel syndrome, menopausal symptoms, menstrual irregularities, infertility, autoimmune diseases such as lupus, diabetes, drug/alcohol/cigarette addiction, chronic fatigue, sciatica, bursitis, asthma, colds and flus, chemotherapy and radiation side effects, and weight management.
