Month	Grade as of fall 2011	Topic	Examples
Front Cover	Kindergarten and younger	Any of the below	
January	First Grade	Conservation	Turn out lights when leaving the room, turn off water when brushing your teeth
February	Second Grade	Reduce	Buy juice in large containers and drink from a glass rather than using individual serving packs
March	Third Grade	Reuse	Reuse yogurt containers for planting seeds
April	Fourth Grade	Recycle	Recycle paper, cardboard, glass and plastic as much as possible
May	Fifth Grade	Drive less	Bike to the store or take the bus rather than drive, group your trips, carpool
June	Sixth Grade	Composting	Compost your food and yard waste, learn about using worms to compost
July	Seventh Grade	Renewable Energy	Use solar or wind to light your garden path, power your home or heat your hot water
August	Eighth Grade	Water Reduction	Plant drought-resistant plants in your yard, cut grass long to reduce the need for watering
September	Ninth Grade	Eat and buy local	Grow your own food or shop at a local farmer's market
October	10 th Grade	Vampire Power	Unplug cell phone, iPod, mp3 chargers from the wall when they are not in use
November	11 th Grade	Vehicle Idling	Turn off car when waiting for someone, turn off car when stopped in construction, etc.
December	12 th Grade	Energy Efficiency	Replace incandescent bulbs with CFLs, replace old appliances with Energy Star appliances
