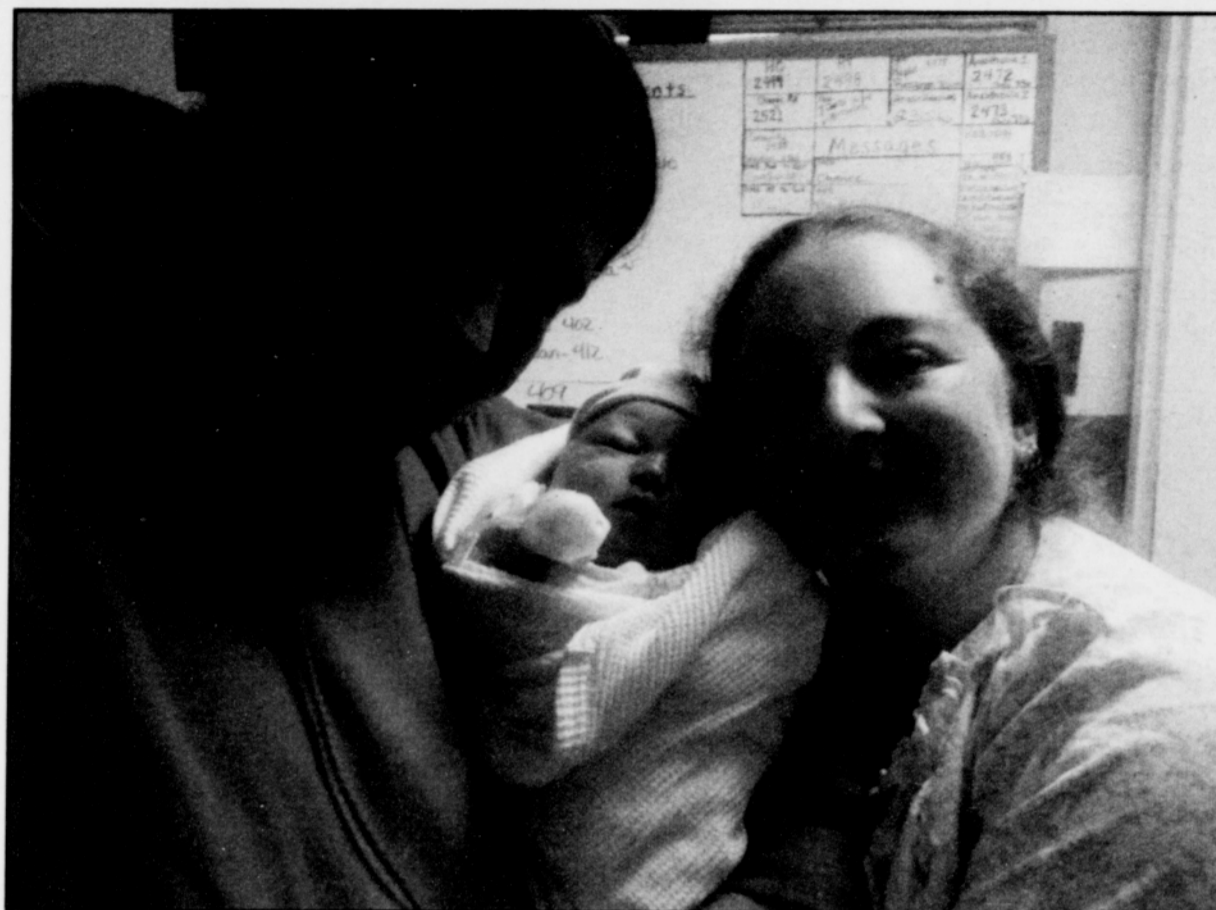
Nehayla Jade Cordova

LIHEAP ready to help low-income families with cost of heating home

What is LIHEAP?

- LIHEAP (Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program) is a federally funded program that helps low-income households with their home energy bills.
- LIHEAP can help you stay warm in the winter. By doing so, you can reduce the risk of health and safety problems (illness, fire or eviction).

What assistance does LIHEAP provide?

- Bill pay assistance
- Crisis assistance (shut-off or final notice)

Who is eligible?

Individuals who meet the requirements below are eligible for bill payment or crisis assistance.

Enrolled Siletz Tribal member

The applicant or a child residing in the household must be an enrolled Siletz Tribal member.

Residence location

The residence must be located within the 11-county service area.

Income eligible

The applicant must meet the annual income guidelines as abbreviated below:

Household Size	Annual Income
1	\$16,335-\$22,321
2	\$22,065-\$29,189
3	\$27,795-\$36,057
4	\$33,525-\$42,925
5	\$39,255-\$49,793

When can I apply?

- Oct. 1 – Siletz Tribal Elders and disabled Tribal members
- Nov. 1 – Other Siletz Tribal households

What information do I need to apply?

To participate in the program, you must submit the following:

1. Application
2. Tribal identification card or CIB
3. Social Security cards for all persons living in your household
4. Recent copies of utility bills (the individual named on the utility bill must be included in the household composition)
5. Final utility termination notice (if you've received a shut-off notice from your energy company)
6. Documents verifying the income of every household member age 18 and older, such as:
 - ♦ A recent payroll stub or other proof of current gross income
 - ♦ Documentation, such as an award letter, showing income from Social Security, unemployment insurance, pension funds, disability, etc.
