Winter Home Maintenance Checklist

- Drain two gallons from electric water heaters to remove silt build-up.
- Dust off or clean electric space heaters.
- Check all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors; replace batteries as needed.
- Check window and door caulking or weather-stripping.
- Clean forced-air vents for maximum output.
- Check caulking around tub and sinks. Replace any old or cracked caulking. Make sure you use the right kind of caulking for the job.
- Clean leaves from gutters. Make sure water can flow freely.
- Cover any outside water faucets with proper weatherproofing materials.
- Check furnace filters. Replace any dirty or built-up filters
- Check your trees and fences for storm damage.
