

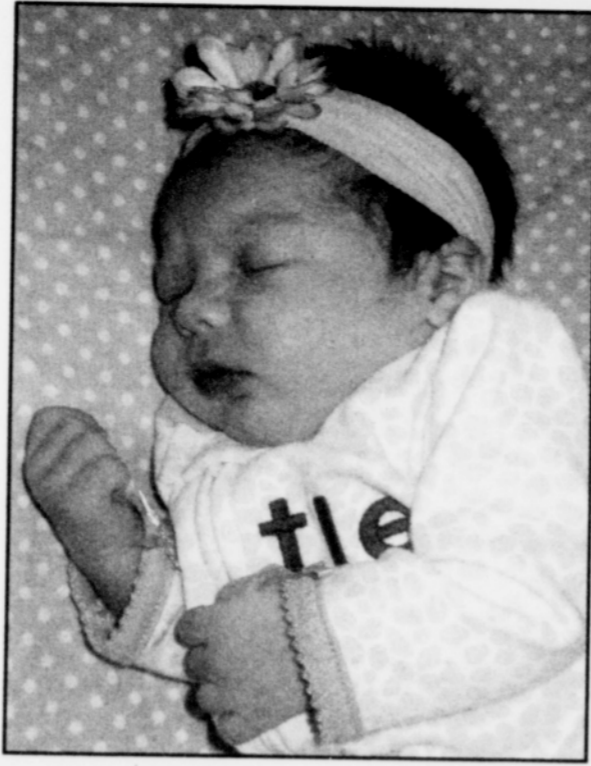
## New Baby!

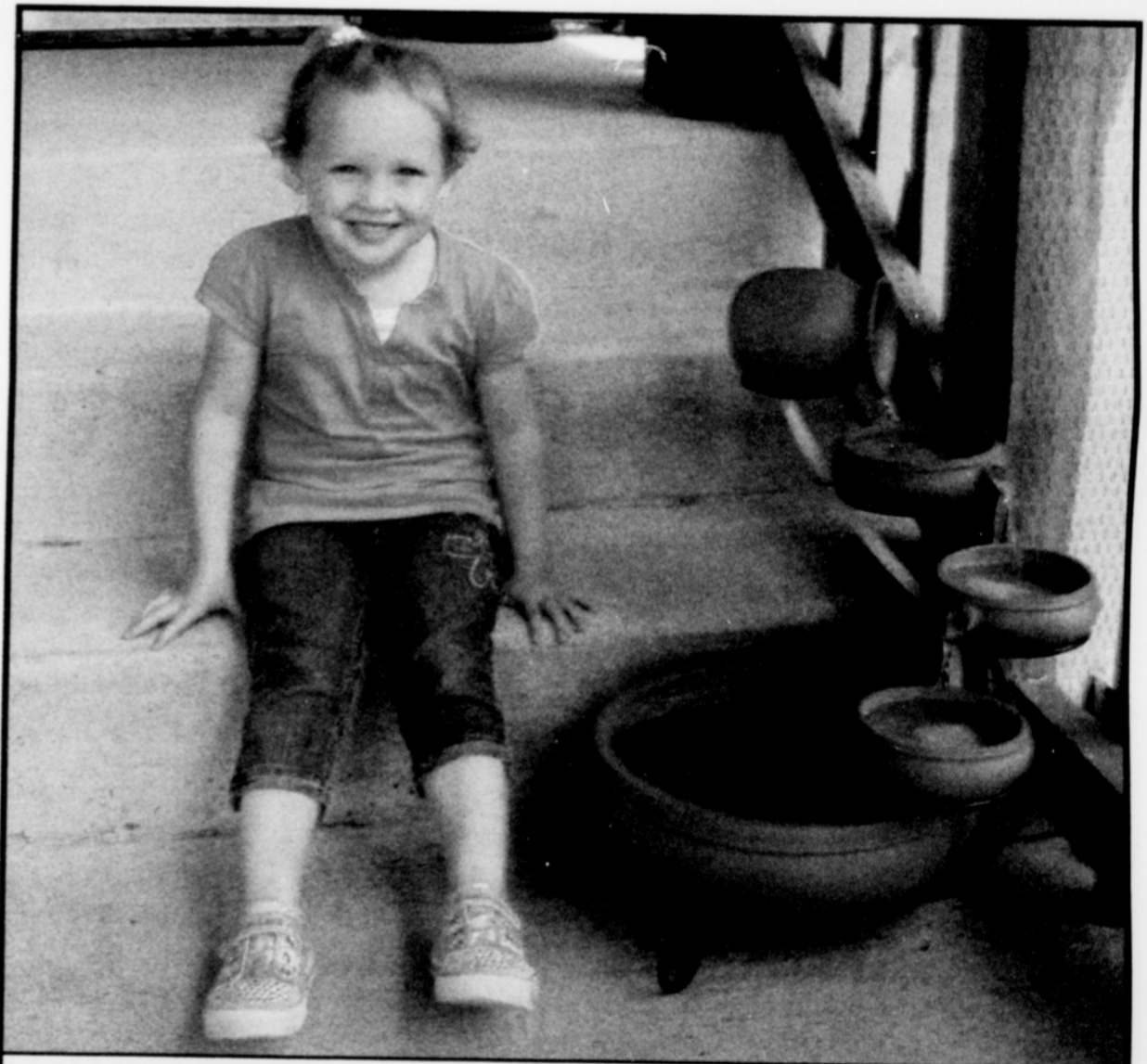
