## Vendors invited to annual Gathering of Oregon's First Nations Pow-Wow

### Tribal member vendors have first shot at tables for event in Salem

Tribal members of the five federally recognized Western Oregon Tribes have the first opportunity to secure vendor tables for the fifth annual Gathering of Oregon's First Nations Pow-Wow at the State Fairgrounds Pavilion in Salem, Ore., on Jan. 26, 2013.

Registration deadline for Tribal member vendors is Nov. 2 at noon. Tables are \$50 per vendor and applications for tables can be obtained by calling 503-879-1418 or stopping at the Grand Ronde Public Affairs Office at 9615 Grand Ronde Road in Grand Ronde.

After this time, tables will be open to the American Indian public. No food vendors are allowed.

Each vendor is allowed two tables. Vendors can split the cost of their table with other Tribal members.

The five Western Oregon Tribes – Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians; Coquille Indian Tribe; Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians; Confederated Tribes of Grande Ronde Community of Oregon; and Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians – again will host the event. Eastern Oregon Tribes also will participate.
