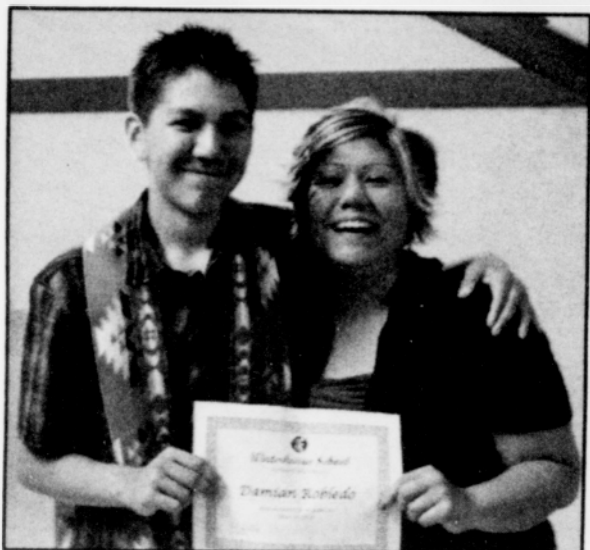


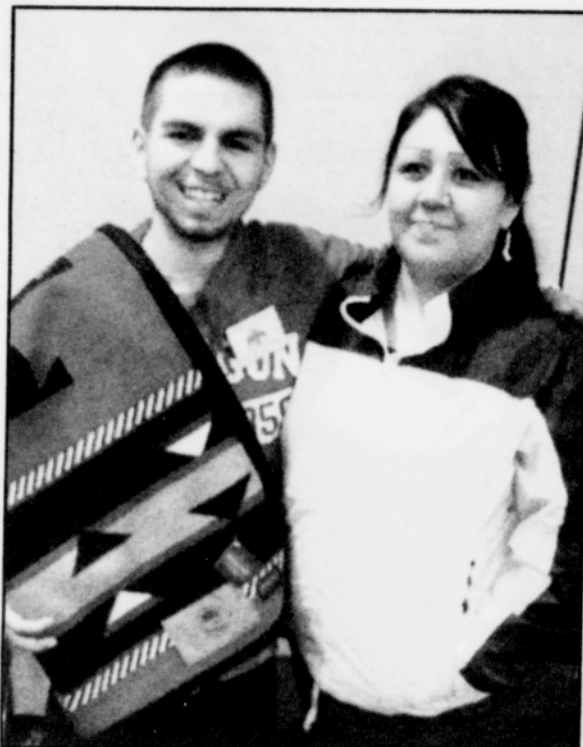

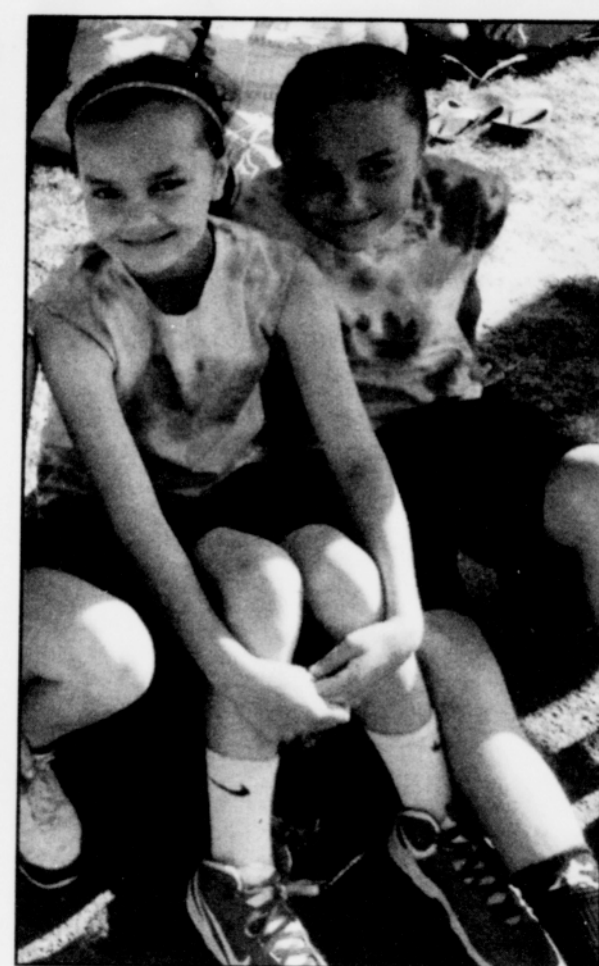

on behalf of our Tribal children.

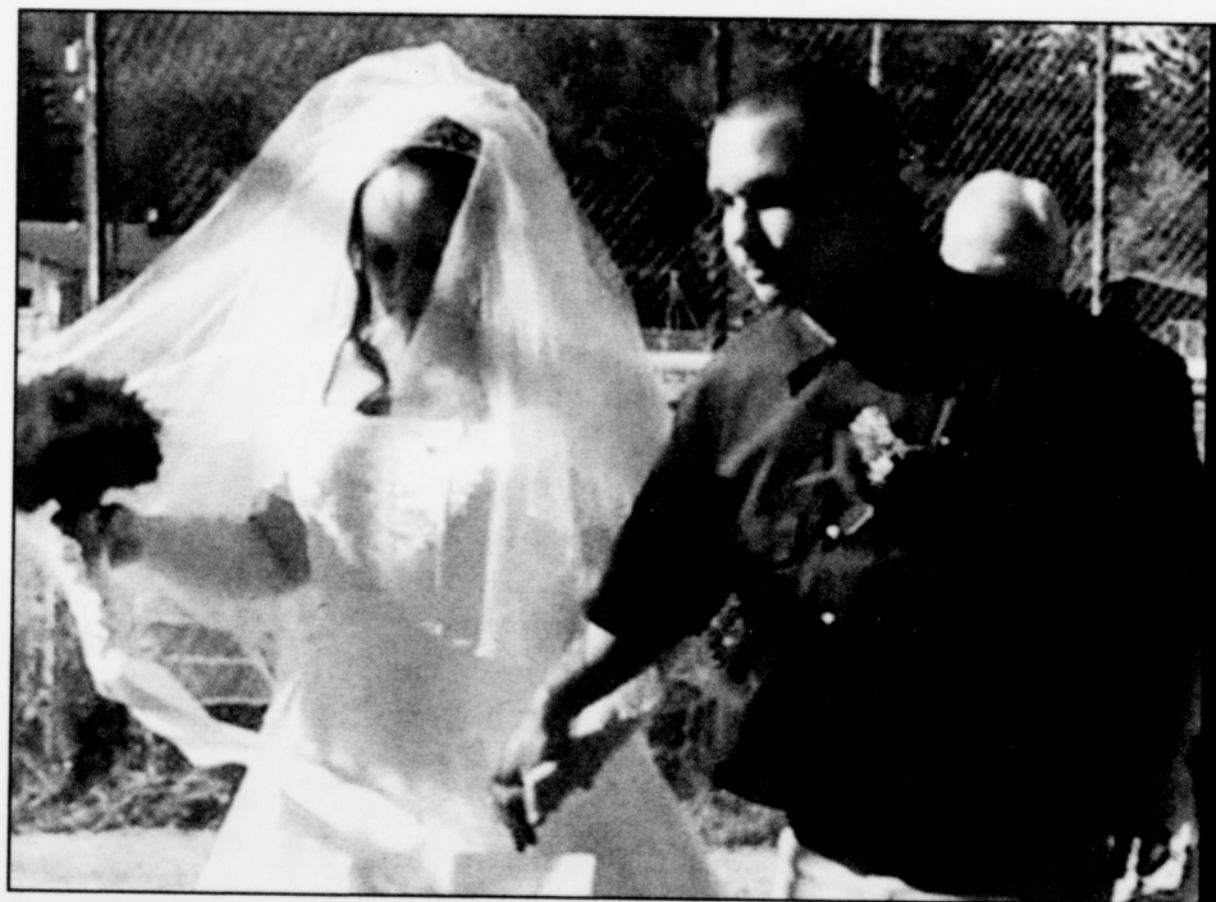
