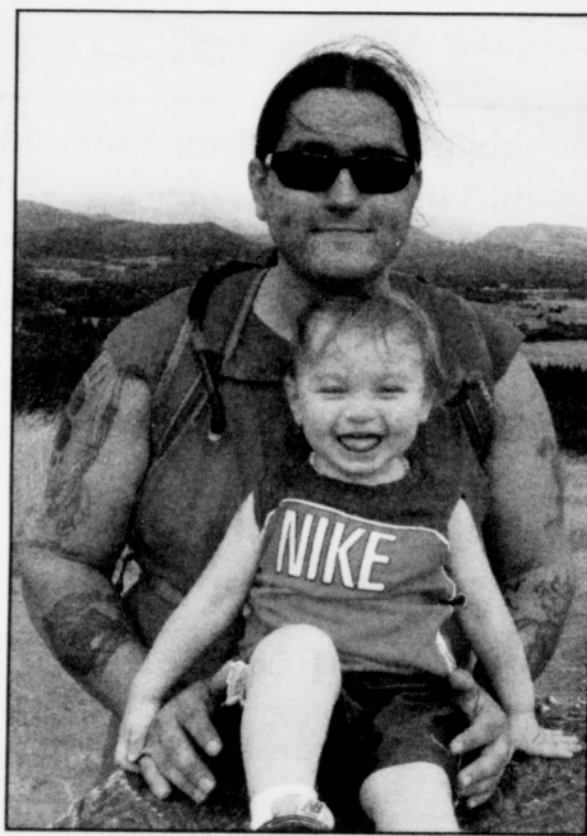

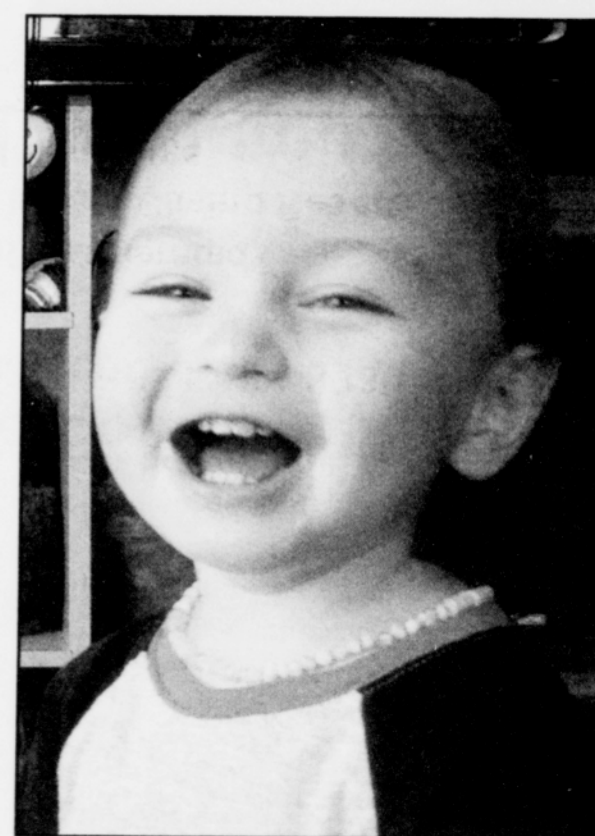
Happiest 2nd Birthday wishes to Miss Liliana Du-Lye-Li Rabideau! You're mama and daddy's heart and you always will be.

Shooting-caused fires on the rise

Two fire starts in Southern Oregon in early September serve as a good reminder to be fire safe while shooting.

One fire was caused by the shooting of an exploding target, while the other fire resulted from a large-caliber rifle round. The rifle round was shot below a road in an uncleared area with dry fuel. The round created a spark when it hit the ground, causing the fire.

Many shooters don't realize there is a fire danger associated with shooting. When a bullet is fired, it carries a lot of energy. When it strikes a hard surface, much of the energy is transferred into heat. That heat can start a fire.

Shooting-caused fires are on the rise around the state. The use of any kind of tracer ammunition or exploding target currently is prohibited under fire season restrictions.

Preventing a shooting-caused fire is not difficult. Place your target in an area cleared of flammable debris that has a dirt backstop. Fire season restrictions require you to carry a fire extinguisher and shovel, and not smoke in forested areas.

The Coos Forest Protective Association asks that recreationists be respectful of the land by keeping a fire-safe attitude and keeping our forests clean.
