

Enjoy the holidays at Festival of Trees and Angels Ball at Chinook Winds

Each year, Angels Anonymous, a local nonprofit organization, presents The Festival of Trees and The Song of the Angels Holiday Ball, the group's largest annual fundraiser, at Chinook Winds Casino Resort. This is the 17th year for the event, which will be held Dec. 2-5.

Wonderful Christmas trees, decorated and sponsored by local businesses and individuals who not only spend hours

decorating the trees but several hundred dollars in decorations on each tree as well, will be on display.

The public is invited to the free viewing of the trees from Dec. 2-4 from noon to 8 p.m. and on Dec. 5 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Bring the whole family to view this wonderland of the Christmas season featuring exceptional trees decorated beyond imagination.

The Angels Ball takes place on Dec. 5 from 5:30-11:30 p.m. It will be a night to dress up in your festive best for an elegant evening on the town.

This year Blackbird, a Beatles-inspired band, returns to provide the evening's entertainment. The auction of the Christmas trees, special items and wreaths will take place during the Angels Ball along with numerous drawings.

Tickets, priced at \$75, include passed hors d'oeuvres, seafood, steak, baked potato and dessert stations, live entertainment, dancing and the auction of the Christmas trees. They can be purchased at the Lincoln City Chamber of Commerce at 4039 NW Logan Road in Lincoln City (541-994-3070).

It might be the young mother left to fend for herself with no money to feed her children, an elderly man who has had his heat turned off in the dead of winter or a young man desperately in need of employment who receives assistance. It's anonymous and a one-time only helping hand extended to residents of north Lincoln County.

During the first three quarters of 2015, Angels Anonymous disbursed more than \$31,000, providing funds for 46 families to meet immediate and basic needs.

Funded Orthodontic Treatment Screening

The program and amount of accepted applicants will depend on funding for that year.

Applicants are selected by case severity and are chosen based on motivation by the patient and parent, reliable transportation

and the oral hygiene of the patient, to name a few.

The non-biased selection process is performed under the guidance of an orthodontic specialist and applicants are chosen through a committee. We want the best results possible for the patient and thus place emphasis on these items in order to achieve this.

This program is open to all ages who are Siletz Tribal members only. All applicants will be notified by mail if they have been chosen.
