Cranberry BBQ sauce

- Ingredients
- 1 can cranberry sauce
 - 1 yellow onion diced
 - 2/3 cup brown sugar
 - 1/2 cup apple cider vinegar
 - 1/2 tsp liquid smoke
 - 2/3 cup ketchup
 - 2 tbsl Dijon mustard optional
 - 2 cloves garlic minced
 - 1 tsp chili powder
 - 2 tbsl ginger minced
 - Salt and pepper to taste

- Instructions
- In a large saucepan over medium-high heat, sauté the diced onion until brown.
 - Add the can of cranberry sauce, brown sugar, apple cider vinegar, liquid smoke, ketchup, Dijon



- mustard, garlic, ginger, and chili. Season with salt and pepper.
- Bring to a boil stirring frequently. Reduce heat to a simmer and cook for 25 minutes or until the sauce begins to thicken.
- You can keep your Cranberry BBQ Sauce chunky or you can puree until smooth.

Siletz elder’s meal services & home deliveries

The Siletz meal-site, located at the Siletz Tribal Community Center, is a space for elders to gather, enjoy a nutritious meal and connect in a welcoming setting. The doors open at 11 a.m. and meals are served every Tuesday and Thursday, at noon. To assist the kitchen with proper preparations, elders are encouraged to contact Maggie McAfee with the Title VI Program at 541-444-8233 or the Elders Department at 541-444-8225.

The Title VI Program covers the cost of the meal for the Tribal Members, their spouses and any caregivers who attend alongside the elder. For elders unable to attend in person due to medical reasons, the Siletz Meals-On-Wheels program offers essential support by delivering meals directly to the elder’s home. Deliveries occur on Tuesdays and Thursdays, with two hot meals provided on each delivery day.

Additionally, a frozen meal is delivered on Thursdays to ensure there is food available on Friday or over the weekend.

To request home deliveries, elders or their family members can contact the Title VI Program at 541-444-8233 to schedule an assessment.

These programs are part of the Tribe’s broad commitment to supporting the health and well-being of its elder community.
