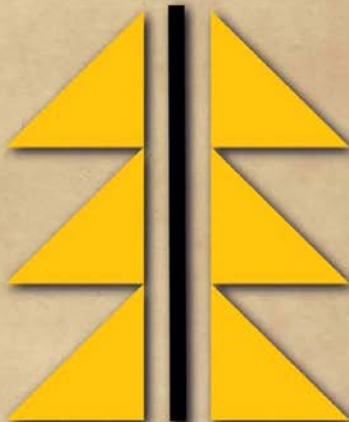

Tribal Enrollment Department

On August 15, 2025, Tribal Council approved our updated CTSI Tribal Identification cards. These cards are considered a Real ID and formatted according to the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI).

These cards have enhanced graphics for security, however they are not Enhanced Tribal Card (ETC). The card expiration remains 10-years. This means you do not need to update your card within this time unless you have changes to your name, address, or corrections. There is a \$5.00 fee for card reprints.

Siletz Tribal Area Offices

Tribal Members may go to their local Siletz Tribal Area Office for assistance with the ID form request and to have a picture taken, however, the Area Office staff will no longer print out Tribal ID cards.

Tribal Enrollment Staff will be scheduling Area Office visits and advertise this through your Area Office newsletters.

How can you get the Tribal ID card?

Come see us in person at 107 SE Swan Avenue in Siletz. Tribal Enrollment Department is open Monday through Friday from 8 am to 4:30 p.m. We are closed all recognized Tribal and Federal holidays.

Contact us if you reside out of area and are unable to see us in Siletz. Staff will assist you.

CIB and Family Tree

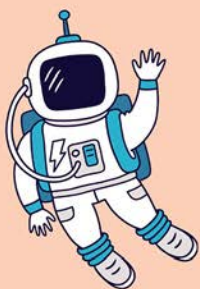
