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If you are driving, pull over to a clear location, stop and stay there with your seatbelt fastened until the shaking stops. Once the shaking stops, proceed with caution and avoid bridges or ramps that might have been damaged.

DO NOT get in a doorway! An early earthquake photo is a collapsed adobe home with the door frame as the only standing part. From this came our belief that a doorway is the safest place to be during an earth-

quake. In modern houses and buildings, doorways are no safer, and they do not protect you from flying or falling objects. Get under a table instead!

DO NOT run outside! Trying to run in an earthquake is dangerous, as the ground is moving and you can easily fall or be injured by debris or glass. Running outside is especially dangerous, as glass, bricks, or other building components may be falling. You are much safer to stay inside and get under a table.

Ground shaking during an earthquake is seldom the cause of injury.

Most earthquake-related injuries and deaths are caused by collapsing walls and roofs, flying glass and falling objects. It is extremely important for a person to move as little as possible to reach the place of safety he or she has identified because most injuries occur when people try to move more than a short distance during the shaking.

Look around you now, before an earthquake. Identify safe places such as under a sturdy piece of furniture or against an interior wall in your home, office or school so that when the shaking starts you can respond quickly. An

immediate response to move to the safe place can save lives.

And that safe place should be within a few steps to avoid injury from flying debris.

This quarter, one of the most notable updates has been the long-anticipated phase 2 of our siding project which includes replacement of the Rogue River Room windows. Progress has also been made on exterior painting which creates a more unified and polished appearance throughout the property.

The Chinook Winds team has remained dedicated to delivering excellent customer service, ensuring every guest feels welcome and at ease amid ongoing construction efforts.

Marketing

We celebrated 30 years in business this summer, making the most of the busy tourist season with a high-energy kickoff—our popular fireworks show and \$100,000 winning Tracks drawing. The anniversary celebrations included a sold-out Jay Leno with Arsenio Hall and a special Elite party creating an exciting atmosphere that encouraged guests to stay and play.

Outdoor events returned stronger than ever, with Beach, Bacon and Brews in July setting another attendance record and raising over \$10,000 for Lincoln County charities. In August, Surf City Weekend brought in more than \$20,000 for Angels Anonymous.

We had a Million-dollar jackpot of \$1,149,056.13 on the Wide Area Progressive Buffalo Power Pays machine on August 16. This win was shared on social media channels and viewed by thousands of guests showcasing our machines are better at the beach.

Our community involvement also remained a priority, with continued support for events like the Neighbors for Kids Golf Tournament, Tillamook County Fair, Siletz Pow Wow, and Stuff a Bus – Backpacks for Kids campaign.

Operations

The Slot department completed 37 machine conversions and installed 26 new machines in this quarter. Some of the popular titles we have added to our floor are Dragon Trio, Devil's Lock, Timber Jack, Railroad Riches, and Willie Nelson. Slots also created a new area for slot machines in the space where the old sports wagering area was located.

Table Games held the second annual Summer Poker Tournament Series in July. The tournament series turned out to be very successful with tournament entries up 16.76% over the prior year. We plan to continue to grow this event, so we have three solid tournaments a year to bring in players to the Casino.

Bingo had a great summer. We added in a \$30,000 Anniversary Bingo for June, we had our \$80,000

Beach Bash event in July and had some very successful Friday Fortune events that all drove our headcounts up.

Food and Beverage

In late May we opened the new Siletz Bay Café after closing the Buffet. This new fast casual restaurant creates the much-needed space to enjoy food and watch your favorite sport on one of the many TV's.

The Café is still in its early stages and continues to progress towards the final goal of what the room will be. For example, all new chairs, tables and booths will be arriving shortly for another piece of the vision to fall into place. Both the Rogue River Room and Chinook's Seafood Grill continue their quarterly specials so be sure to watch for the next one coming soon.

Facilities

The siding project remains on track, with installation of new windows at the Rogue River Room scheduled for mid-September. Resort painting efforts have begun in alignment with the siding project. Work is currently underway on the Sky Bridge, Parking Garage, and Suites Building, along with the rest of the hotel to ensure a consistent, refreshed look across the property.

Hotel

The hotel experienced a successful summer season, marked by increases in both occupancy and revenue. Building on this momen-

tum, we have begun updating the exterior of the hotel to align with the new Casino exterior. This is just the beginning of a broader initiative to elevate the overall appearance and appeal of the property.

In addition to the exterior enhancements, we are currently in the planning stages of several new projects aimed at further enhancing and upscaling the entire guest experience. Our goal is to transform the look and feel of the property, while continuing to improve the comfort and satisfaction of our guests.

We continue to host a Men's Club that meets every Thursday afternoon.
