Siletz Tribe distributes \$248,109.02 in charitable giving to Oregon non-profits

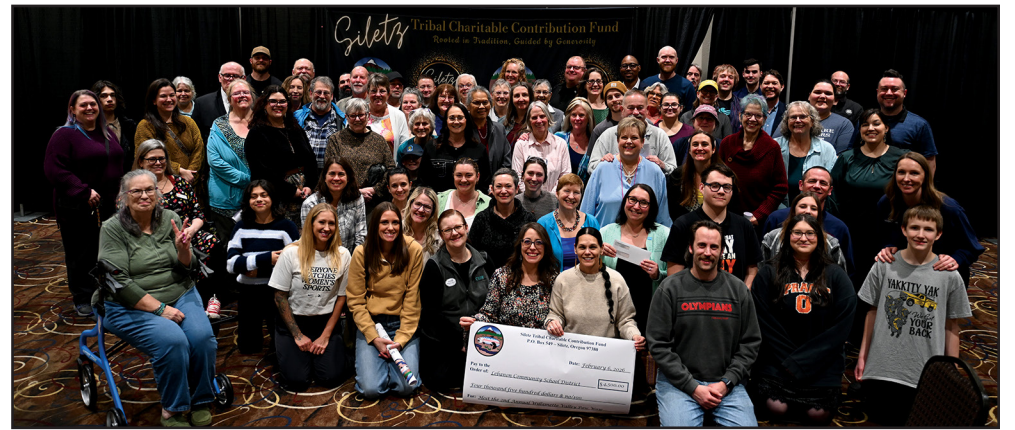

The Siletz Tribal Charitable Contribution Fund (STCCF) distributed \$231,298.09 to organizations in the state on Friday, Feb. 6, at the first quarter award ceremony.

The Siletz Tribe has made contributions through employment, monetary donations and cooperative measures to the Siletz community, Lincoln County and the state of Oregon. The seven-member charitable fund advisory board has distributed more than \$19.5 million since its inception in 2001. Chinook Winds has donated more than \$7.5 million in cash and fund-raising items since it opened in 1995. The casino also provides in-kind donations of convention space for various fund-raisers as well as technical support, manpower for many events.

The 2nd quarter deadline to apply is March 2, 2026. Applications are due by 4:30 p.m. The deadline is final, postmarks are not accepted.

Early application submission is recommended. When possible, apply 1-2 weeks prior to the deadline to allow time for basic screening and to correct applications where required. Assistance is provided as appropriate.

The eligibility for money from the charitable fund is limited to two categories:

- Entities and activities located in the Siletz Tribe's 11-county service area (Lincoln, Tillamook, Linn, Lane, Benton, Polk, Yamhill, Marion, Multnomah, Washington and Clackamas counties)
- Native American entities and activities located anywhere in the U.S.
