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OUR SCHOOLS.

That graded schools are far superior to what may be termed a common country school is admitted by all. That the grading of schools even in the country, when practicable, is urged and recommended by our best educators, is known by all who take an interest in the education of our children.

Among the first questions asked by a prospective citizen, if he be a man of family, is: What kind of schools have you? Or, have you a graded school system in your city? And the result will probably be, if you are compelled to answer in an unsatisfactory manner, that he will go elsewhere to find a location.

The values of property in either city or country to a considerable extent are enhanced or depressed in the same proportion as its schools are thorough and efficient, or imperfect and unsatisfactory.

In our opinion the schools of Scio would be very much benefitted if the two districts could be united in one harmonious whole. Among the benefits to be derived would be the ability to employ a more efficient corps of teachers, a better classification of the pupils, thereby enabling more advanced branches to be taught, and a general and more satisfied condition of things.

THE Northern Pacific Railroad Co. have purchased a majority of the stock of the Seattle, Lake Shore & Eastern railroad and have leased the road upon a basis of a guaranty of 6 1/2 per cent. interest on the outstanding bonds, and a further issue of bonds necessary to complete the road to the international boundary.

THE Oregon Press Association meets in Portland next month, and arrangements for the meeting are now being made. It is hoped to make this by far the most interesting convention the Oregon editors have had.

THE Oregonian of Thursday gives to its readers the account of the official correspondence between the governments of the United States and Great Britain that has just been transmitted by Secretary Blaine to congress on the Behring Sea muddle.

WE clip the following from the Sunday Oregonian:

"The census of Oregon is showing the same tendency of population to gather in the cities that is noticed all over the country. It is unlikely that the total population of the state has increased more than 100 per cent. since 1850. While most of the cities reported so far have gained 200 per cent., some of the estimates given by the supervisor are remarkable. Salem remains the second city in the state, but falls sadly short of the 10,000 claimed. Albany exceeds the expectation of its people and comes within 200 of Salem, with 7000 people. Grant's Pass shows the greatest growth, 300 per cent. since 1850. Roseburg, Eugene, Ashland and Oregon City show about the normal urban gain, 200 per cent."
