of making parachute jumps from great heights. Persons who thus needlessly hazard their lives, are certainly not sane, and should be restrained by law. It does not only lead to the fatal termination of their valueless lives, but stimulates that morbid love of notoriety that tempts others to be equally as fool-hardy, who perhaps otherwise would never attempt such hazardous feats.

THE recent deaths that have occurred in parachute jumping, admonish us that they are always attended with great danger to the participant, and very frequently with fatal results. That men will thus needlessly take their lives in their hands for mere financial gain, is to say the least reprehensible, and should be condemned by both society and legal enactment. The stimulating of that morbid curiosity of the human mind that craves and does enjoy such daredevil exploits as led to the death of Redmond and Cosgrove, should be punished and extirpated from the human mind. Females and fools who thus cater to the grosser elements of our nature, do not add an iota to human happiness, and lead us to place too low an estimate on human life. It cultivates and stimulates the same elements of human nature that delighted Roman audiences of old in gladiatorial combats; that witnesses Spanish bull fights with placid satisfaction, and goats with pleasure in the giving and taking punishment in the prize ring.

Human life is, as it should be, prized above price. And the protection thrown around it by our laws, is being continually increased as civilization progresses. Self destruction is guarded against by our law makers to as great a degree as possible. Should they not add to the list of punishable offences, such fool-hardy exploits as leaping from high bridges into the water, or running Niagara falls in barrels, or
