Satan's whole aim is to get self-interest to be the chief end of man. Greed in all forms is contrary to what Jesus lived and taught. Peter wanted Jesus to continue with him.

Jesus wanted Peter to follow behind not self-interest, not thinking blindly of himself but being aware and willing to act to alleviate pain for others.

"If My People Pray" was the sermon topic presented by visiting pastor, Tim Zollbrecht, of Grants Pass. His purpose was to strengthen the belief that prayer is an important component of the life of a Christian.
