The theme, "To Believe," continued with Romans 4:3-12, 18-25, where Paul shows how God gives His own righteousness to those who believe. For Jesus took our place and died for us.

Paul uses Abraham and David as examples: "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness" (Rom. 1:3) "David ... speaks of the blessedness of the man to whom God credits righteousness apart from works, "Blessed are they whose transgressions are covered" (Rom. 4:6-7).

Paul adds that believers, like Abraham, will be credited with God's own righteousness through their faith (Rom. 4:23-24).

St. Patrick of the Forest Catholic Church

Sunday's readings were about God's justice and mercy, with focus on Matthew 20, about a vineyard owner who went to the marketplace at different times of the day and hired workers for his vineyard.

This parable says something to us about God's justice and mercy. It could be said that God gave each laborer what he needed; not what he

earned. Those who worked all day were treated with justice, while those who worked only part of a day were treated with mercy.

Those who worked only a part of the day didn't "earn" their day's wage, but they had the same human needs, and in mercy the vineyard owner fulfilled those needs.

Seventh-day Adventist

Dr. Willard Regester, of Murphy, spoke on "The Confessions of Tax Collector, basing his remarks on the encounter of Jesus and Zacchaeus in Luke 19:1-10.

Zacchaeus of Jericho was a member of a hated occupation because he made his living by collecting taxes from Jews on behalf of the Roman government. He became famous in the record of Jesus' ministry as the short man who climbed the Sycamore-fig tree to see Jesus.

The hidden fact is that some person or persons must have piqued Zacchaeus' interest in Jesus by relating what Jesus had done for them.

Community Bible

Continuing in Genesis 1:31, "On the sixth day, God saw everything that He had made and it was very good. On the seventh day, God

blessed and sanctified this day and rested from all His good creation.

"The Lord God planted the Garden of Eden, and though rain had not yet been created, mist and four streams were used to water the grounds. The man was given dominion over the garden and was told to eat from all the trees, including the tree of life. Rev.: 22, The tree of life bore 12 fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month ... but he was forbidden to eat from the tree of knowledge."

Pastor David Goodrich's lesson was from Matthew 20:1-16. A wealthy vineyard owner hired workers at 8 a.m., noon and 5 p.m. and paid the same wage to all. The earlier workers were upset because the 5 p.m. workers got paid the same for a very short time of work.

The vineyard owner replied that it was his prerogative. He provided one day's pay, enough to sustain the laborers one day, as promised.

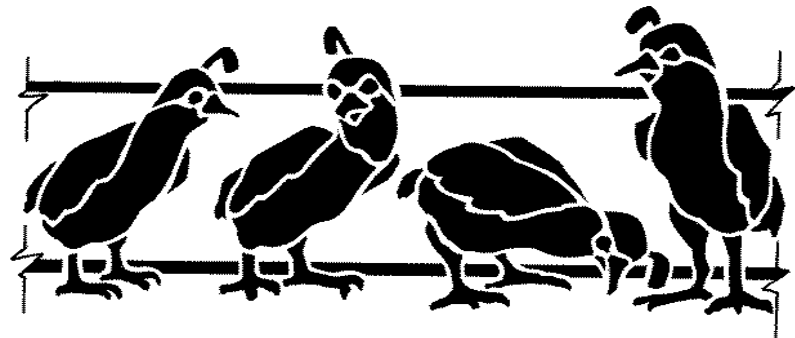
