Flu season is here; get shot

is approaching, and there will be plenty of vaccine this year, so public health officials at the Oregon Dept. of Human Services (DHS) are getting the word out that it's time to think about flu shots.

"People at a high risk of complications from the flu, and those who come in contact with them should start getting their immunizations immediately," said Lorraine Duncan, of DHS. "Manufacturers are able to meet all production demands and we anticipate no vaccine shortages," she said.

Public health officials recommend that persons at a higher risk of complications from influenza be vaccinated during October and November. They identified higher-risk persons as:

*All persons 65 years of age and older; residents of nursing homes or chronic care facilities; persons 6 months and older

who have chronic illnesses such as asthma, diabetes, renal disease and immune deficiencies; children younger than 19 years old who are receiving long-term aspirin therapy; and women who will be in the second or third trimester of pregnancy during flu season.

*Healthy children 6 to 23 months, whenever feasible, based on recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), a panel of medical experts that reviews immunization practices and recommend improvements in national immunization efforts.

*All persons who live, work or provide care to high-risk persons listed above. This includes household members, health-care workers and employees of nursing homes and care facilities; providers of home-care and day-care for young children. Parents and caregivers of

infants up to 6 months are especially encouraged to get a flu shot.

Influenza is characterized by abrupt onset of fever, headache, sore throat, cough and muscle aches. Unlike other common respiratory illnesses, the flu "is associated with a striking sense of unwellness accompanied with a loss of appetite and weakness lasting several days."
