Items on the agenda include the recent expiration of the period of segregation on approximately 33,000 acres of Bureau of Land Management lands connected with the proposed mineral withdrawal of January 22, 2001, and the continuation of the illegally proposed mineral withdrawal and illegal segregation on approximately 83,000 acres of the Siskiyou National Forest.

The WMD, established in 1852, is Oregon's oldest mining district. The purpose of the WMD is to preserve, protect, and promote mining in Southwest Oregon.

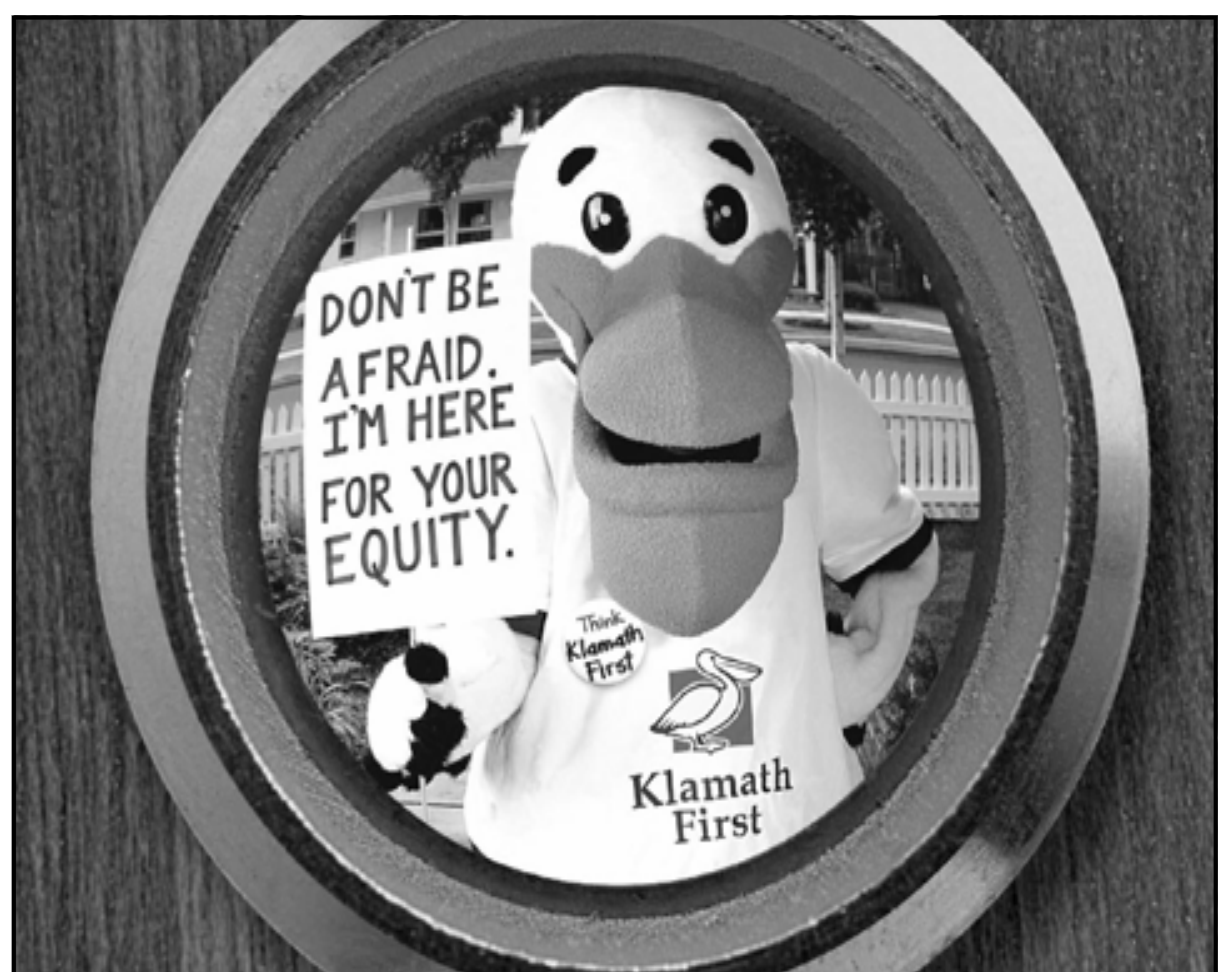
