"OLCC is very concerned about underage drinking, and we know that minors get alcohol from buying it at the store, either directly, or with false ID," said Linda Ignowski, director of OLCC's regulatory division.

"But another popular way to get it is from adults," she said. "This is a real concern for us, because as everyone knows, underage drinking

"Adults need to realize that they are breaking the law by furnishing alcohol to a minor, so we are trying to get that message out," said Ignowski. "We're asking adults to refrain from selling or providing alcohol to minors."

"You don't know what these kids are going to do with that alcohol. You give it to them, they get in the car -- what if they're in a car accident because they've been drinking?"

"You, in essence, had helped in that accident," she said.
