



Studded tire season over

Studded tire season ended on Tuesday, April 1, requiring motorists to remove studded tires from their vehicles.

"Although temperatures in Oregon will be lower than normal during the next few days, the National Weather Service is not predicting more precipitation than ODOT crews are prepared to handle in order to keep roadways open to motorists," said State Highway Maintenance Engineer Doug Tindall.

Drivers with studded tires on their vehicles after April 1 can be charged with a class "C" traffic violation, which carries a maximum \$150 fine.

An estimated \$11 million is spent each year in the state to repair studded tire damage on city streets, county roads and state highways.
