The Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board plans to hold a public hearing on the potential acquisition of a conservation easement on a 30.83 acre floodplain parcel along the main-stream of Williams Creek near Williams in Josephine County. The hearing will take place in Williams, Wednesday, April 23, 2003, from 4:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. at the Williams Grange, 20100 Williams Hwy. The Board plans to hold a conservation easement on the parcel as a condition of a grant award to the Williams Creek Watershed Council to purchase the property, and to ensure that the property's use is consistent with the Board's constitutional mandate—the protection and restoration of native salmonids, fish and wildlife habitat, watersheds, and water quality. A Board representative will be at the hearing to receive public comment and to answer questions about the proposed conservation easement. Representatives from the Williams Creek Watershed Council, Southern Oregon Land Conservancy, and Josephine County will also be present to answer questions and discuss the management plan for the property. *A man reported finding what he thought were human remains near the swinging bridge near McCaleb Ranch.

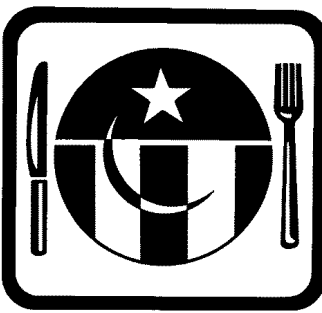
Friday, April 4
