*At Lake Selmac, a paddle boat valued at \$600 was said to be taken. The boat was located and recovered with \$150 worth of damage.

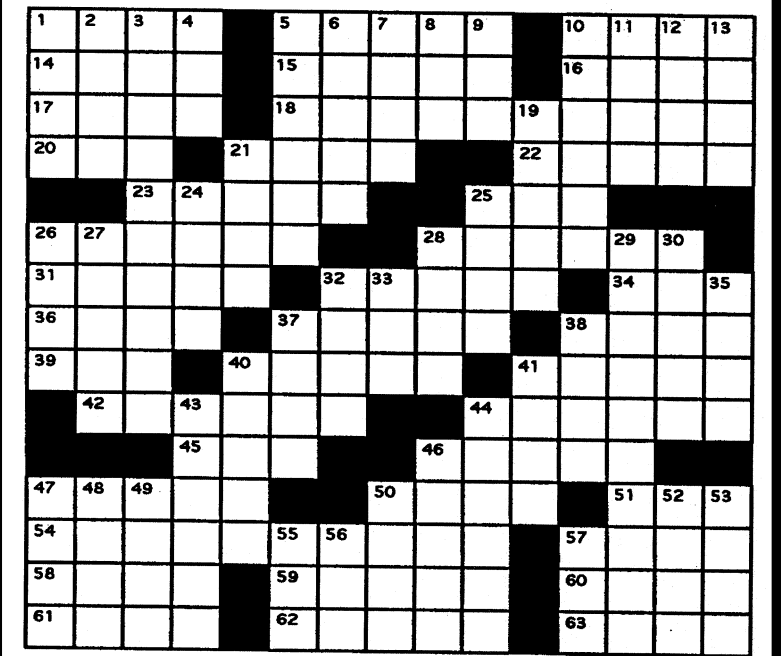
*In the 5000 block of Caves Hwy. a woman complained of hip pain after being pushed by her husband. No charges were filed.
