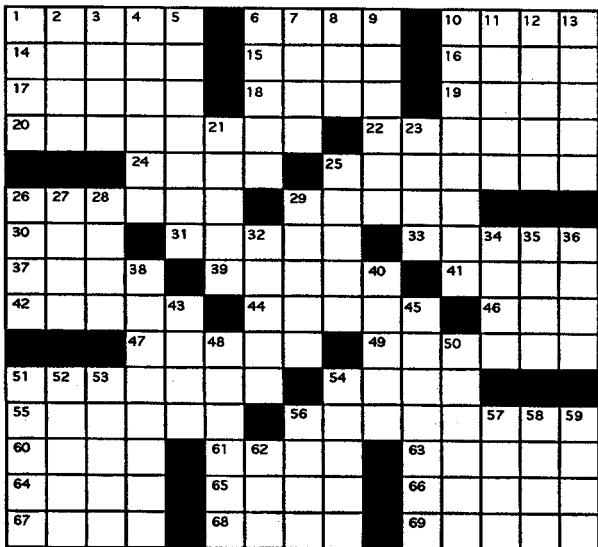
*A man in the 24300 block of Redwood Hwy. said his ex-girlfriend used his debit card without his permission. Deputies said the case was unfounded as a crime.
