Wednesday, July 2 *In the 100 block of S. Redwood Hwy. a woman said that an elderly woman described "so much pain she wanted to kill herself." Deputies said she was upset over a recent surgery.

*Two men ran from a vehicle on Boudry Lane after a woman heard a loud bang. The vehicle had a broken windshield and back window. Deputies advised the men to remove the vehicle, but said that no crime was committed.
